Do you have a baby or toddler under three? Want seven hours a week parenting your child?

Early Head Start offers a bi-weekly opportunity for incarcerated mothers and their children to strengthen their relationship and to preserve the bond of attachment while

separated. Mothers gain hands-on parenting experience while their children learn through play and exploration.

Early Head Start is a national program established in 1995 to promote healthy prenatal outcomes, enhance the development of infants and toddlers, and promote healthy family functioning. The mission of the Early Head Start program at Coffee Creek is to promote, strengthen and support bonding and attachment between infants and toddlers and their incarcerated mothers.

Requirements:

- Child aged zero to three
- Minimum or minimum eligible with gate clearance
- Child lives less than 60 minutes away
- Transportation to and from the school (not provided by EHS) Tues/Thurs 9-12:30

From Green Team

The Butterfly program in Medium and Minimum are working to bring new life to endangered Taylor's Checkerspot and Oregon Silverspot Butterflies. Working with the Zoo's Professional Lab Technicians who happily teach, assist and train the participating women is an amazing way to get skills in science and hands on experience fit for Biology Labs.

Recently Minimum harvested 1,121 cups of viola leaves, which fed 1,631 butterfly larvae coming out of diapause. Over 1200 Silverspots were released to protected habitats along the Oregon Coast with a 76% success rate, up 11% from last year! With our helping hands the Zoo is now able to undertake more animal projects to help refill the earth with much needed biodiversity.

Last month at the Carnival, we weren't the only ones signing energy pledges! Entire staffs at the Dome and CDC buildings were also challenged to sign energy pledges. It's encouraging to see our efforts joined by others to help our planet. Together we can make an impact with small choices in everyday living. From brushing our teeth & showering with less water, to unplugging electronics not in use and turning the lights off when we leave.

RULE CHANGES

From DOC

Below is a list of status changes for the DOC administrative rules since 7/18/17:

291-058: Structured, Intermediate Sanctions for Offenders

- These proposed changes are necessary to modify how Community Corrections address violations of offenders under community supervision, which includes sanctions and incentives. The Administrative Sanctions Grid has been modified accordingly.

The last day to submit comments is **October 30, 2017.**

Photo Shop News:

Crediting Photo Tickets

Tickets purchased on the kiosk can be used at all of the institutions except CRCI and SCI and should only be presented for credit if you are transferred to one of these institutions.

Effective Monday, November 13, 2017, if you have purchased photo tickets and then transferred to an institution that does not use the NWC Photo Program you will need to:

Send tickets to NWC for credit within 30 days of transfer. Supply a sales receipt for the ticket(s) that is not older than six months.

If you don't have a receipt for the tickets, credit will not be issued.

Photos for Parolees

AIC's who are paroling and may still be waiting on their photos to be processed or delivered must send a pre-paid, self-addressed envelope to NWC Photo Shop. Photos will not be sent without the appropriate sized envelope or forwarding address. Pictures that have not been claimed 60 days after paroling will be discarded.

Calendar & Stationery	10 x 13 Manilla Envelopes

Commissary Reminders:

Your name, SID #, Institution, Unit & Bunk # must be filled out on your canteen slip or your order will not be filled. Write legibly or your order will not be filled. Mark all your selections clearly in the boxes next to the items. You are allowed one commissary order per week. If you have non-sufficient funds, your order will not be processed. Please Do Not Draw or Doodle on form. Write legibly or your order will not be filled. Prices are subject to change without notice.

Soda Coupon Reminder:

Soda coupons that have been “eaten” by the vending machine do not get refunded by commissary; the commissary order form states “USE OF SODA MACHINES IS AT YOUR OWN RISK. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GRANTED”. Please do not submit an inmate communication to commissary requesting a refund for a soda coupon that has been lost to the soda machine.

LEGAL CLERK WANTED

The library is currently taking applications for a legal clerk position. The **required** qualifications are as follows:

- High school diploma or GED
- Computer skills, preferably Microsoft Word
- Ability to communicate verbally and in written form
- Exceptional attention to detail
- Acceptable institution record of demeanor. This means clear conduct (no major OR minor infractions) for at least 6 months, and that you have been serving time at Coffee Creek for at least 6 months this incarceration.
- Typing skills at 40 words per minute
- Minimum of 2 years left to serve in Medium
- Ability to work under pressure and take direction.
- Ability to maintain good working relationships with the library coordinator, other inmate workers and library users
- No computer fraud crimes in your history

- No misconduct reports of misuse of equipment systems

Women who speak and write both Spanish and English fluently or those who have previous work experience in the legal field are especially encouraged to apply. If you are interested in this position, complete an application on your unit and send it to Ms. Wheeler. Your application must be received by September 30, 2017.

People who come to this workshop day will:

- Understand more about what blocks self-compassion
- Learn how trauma changes the brain
- Experience significant personal growth in the way they see themselves and others
- Get to contribute to others' well-being
- Be able to explore puzzling and confusing aspects of their lives

Ask others who have come about whether this work will help you. If you've come before, come again to learn more, make more progress and to help others.

If you are interested in the Clinic Orderly position, pick up and complete an Inmate Work Application on your unit. Address your completed application to Health Services and submit by placing in the Health Services kyte box on your unit. Applications received will be screened by Inmate Work Programs (IWP). Applicants who meet the minimum qualifications will be scheduled and called out for an interview. Thanks for your interest.

You must be incentive level 2 or 3, not on a plan, LOP or get a cell in on Bee Day.

This class cannot interfere with work or other class. Screening will include your conduct history and if you qualify for Minimum or not. Inmates who will not go to Minimum will be given first opportunity. You cannot be allergic to bees.
