Early Head Start offers a bi-weekly opportunity for incarcerated mothers and their children to strengthen their relationship and to preserve the bond of attachment while separated. Mothers gain hands-on parenting experience while their children learn through play and exploration.

Early Head Start is a national program established in 1995 to promote healthy prenatal outcomes, enhance the development of infants and toddlers, and promote healthy family functioning. The mission of the Early Head Start program at Coffee Creek is to promote, strengthen and support bonding

and attachment between infants and toddlers and their incarcerated mothers.

### Requirements:

- Child aged zero to three
- Minimum or minimum eligible with gate clearance
- Child lives less than 60 minutes away
- Transportation to and from the school (not provided by EHS) Tues/Thurs 9-12:30

### Reminder on CD28

- 1) CD 28's for legal/official mail. The property officer also has the ability to allow a CD 28 for property mail outs or oversized items. The inmates must utilize the proper size envelopes to mail items. We also have adopted and inmates can purchase flat rate boxes and priority envelopes for heavier items that need to be shipped.
- 2) Legal mail has to go through the legal library where they verify and track the legal mail items. Then they stamp and sign the CD 28 as approved.
- 3) With the holidays remind your correspondents to put a full return name and address on the letter or it will be returned to sender.
- 4) When sending kytes you must include your name, unit and bunk. Also when sending a kyte make sure you have the following:
  - a) Department
  - b) Individual needs a department too

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## **PREA ADVOCATE SUPPORT**

*From the CCCF PREA Team*

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*PREA standards mandate that agencies will attempt to make a confidential, community advocate available to inmate victims of sexual abuse. The following information explains how DOC and CCCF are ensuring we are compliant with that standard:*

### **Community-Based PREA Advocate (Support) Program**

It is normal for people who experience sexual abuse to feel overwhelmed and have a lot of questions about what their options are.

Beginning Friday, April 1, 2016, inmates at CCCF who have experienced sexual abuse may reach a community-based advocate by dialing 711 or 1-800-640-5311 from the inmate telephone system. Sexual Assault Resource Center (SARC) is the local community-based advocacy center for CCCF. SARC provides survivors of sexual abuse information about their options, resources, information and emotional support. There is no charge for calls to the SARC.

Role of an Advocate:

- ☞ Provide confidential support and crisis intervention
- ☞ Inform you about the investigation and medical examination process
- ☞ Educate you about healing from sexual abuse
- ☞ Offer resources and referrals

Advocates will:

- ☞ Not tell you what to do
- ☞ Not communicate with the institution unless you request them to do so and sign a release
- ☞ Not provide legal advice

Community-based advocacy centers provide sexual abuse support to people of all genders. Community-based advocates will not report unless you request them to do so and if you sign a release of information.

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## ***EXCITING PUPPY PROGRAM NEWS***

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There is something exciting taking place at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility (CCCF) and we want you to know about it!

The Coffee Creek Puppy Program (CCPP) is working in collaboration with Cristina Keef, Portland Veterinarian Medical Association (PVMA) Director to launch a Generosity fundraising page. The proceeds from the fundraising will go to setting up a training area for the Canine Companions for Independence (CCI) puppy training currently being done here at CCCF.

What this means specifically is the funds will be used for cameras, fencing, K9 turf, training equipment, and other security measures in an area between J/K & G/H yards. This will allow the puppies a larger area to train off the general population yard. It will allow the program a small amount of expansion regarding the number of puppies trained as well.

While Ms. Keef's involvement is separate from the PVMA, it is due to the partnership between the PVMA, CCCF, and her dedication to the program here at CCCF. The PVMA has also pledged to kick start this funding page by donating \$2,000.00.

The program has purchased donation gifts that were largely made by female inmate at Coffee Creek in an effort to keep the focus on the valuable work being done by inmates at CCCF.

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## ***SURVIVOR COACH OPENING***

*From Ms. Arrington, Diversity Coordinator*

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The purpose of the Survivor Coaching program is to provide an opportunity for inmates on intake status, general population inmates and those coming out of long term segregation housing to meet with veteran inmates who can provide peer support and answer questions about the incarceration experience at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility.

### **Eligibility**

- Must live in the medium facility and not eligible for transfer to the minimum facility within the following one year period
- Must have served at least two current years in a Department of Corrections facility
- Must not have been on a major misconduct sanction in the past year
- Must be program compliant
- Weekly work/program schedule must allow for you to participate in the Intake Orientation class, meet with inmates on housing units during scheduled times, be on call for crisis support and attend the monthly Coaching Program meeting

### **Additional Information**

- No points will be awarded to inmates who serve as Coaches. This is a volunteer position

- Must possess the following characteristics
  - Personal integrity
  - Strong communication skills
  - Ability to show compassion
  - Ability to interact and work with DOC staff and fellow peer Survival Coaches
  - An understanding of diversity without prejudice
  - Have a realistic understanding of incarceration issues
  - Have a positive outlook for growth
  - One year commitment to the program

Inmates interested in becoming a Survival Coach should completely fill out a job application and submit it to L. Arrington – Diversity Coordinator. Please attach your application to a Kyte with a brief explanation as to why you are interested in becoming a Survival Coach.

Application deadline is Friday, December 30, 2016. No applications received after that date will be accepted.

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### ***PROPERTY STORAGE AND CHANGES***

*From Sgt. Bronson, Property Room*

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Inmates will have to be able to store all property into 2 tank boxes that are provided for each bunk. This will not include State Clothing, Library/Education Books, TV, Guitar, Musical Keyboard or a radio/CD Player. Legal totes do not have to fit into the 2 tank boxes however you are only allowed to put legal paperwork in them. As a reminder staff have the right to search your legal mail and/or totes and any items in there. They are not there to be read your legal work but they must be able to search it for contraband and items that are not authorized to be in those legal totes. Headphones will need to be able to fit into the tank boxes. Magazines/Books including Educational books that you purchase are considered personal property and therefore will need to be stored in the 2 tank boxes. Only craft items can be in the craft box. If non-craft items are found in your craft box, the property will be confiscated and your craft box returned to Lifeskills. All craft boxes need to be turned in to Life Skills.

Having all of your property in your tank boxes will cut down on theft/missing items as your tank boxes should be secured. Your shelves are to be divided and not share over each other's shelving space. Staff should be able to walk into the cell and automatically know whose property belongs to which bunk. You cannot be mixing your property together. You already have 1 lock when you entered here at CCCF and you are encouraged to buy a 2<sup>nd</sup> lock to be able to secure your property. If you choose to purchase canteen items then I would strongly urge you to purchase the second lock. **DOC/CCCF is not liable for**

**your property if you fail to secure it.** Your personal/canteen items on your shelf must be able to fit into your 2 tank boxes. By CCCF's discretion you no longer have to count your state clothing as part of the 2 tank boxes. This will allow more than enough room for all your shelf property to be secured in those 2 tank boxes when rolled up. CCCF is allowing you not to count your state clothing at this time. If this becomes a problem then CCCF can choose to have your state clothing count towards your storage. However, you are still responsible for your state clothing and if you choose to purchase too many items that you cannot secure your clothing, you will still be held responsible for your state clothing should it come up damaged or missing.

When you move from cell to cell you will take your 2 tank boxes with you and return the others from your new cell to your old cell. When you roll up for court or medical and such, you will need to bring your 2 tank boxes to the property room as you would if they were in the denim bags. Even if you only use 1 tank box you need to take both with you to make sure that each bunk has enough totes and will stay consistent. If you know you have too much property then I would highly encourage you to come down over the next few Sunday's during MP3/MP4 and CD28 line along with items that you need to have hot trashed/mailed out/or picked up.

**Again the items that do not have to fit into the 2 tank boxes are:**

**\*Guitar**

**\*Electric musical keyboard**

**\*CD Player, MP3/MP4, Radio**

**\*TV**

**\*Craft Box with ONLY Craft Items in them.**

**\*Legal Totes with ONLY legal property in them.**

**\*Library Books and Education Books** (however these will be returned to the library and education when your property is rolled up. Do not leave any personal items such as pictures and such in books that you do not own because you might lose them. Also just because someone stamps or writes donated on a book does not mean that book is now your property. You did not purchase it and therefore they will be turned into the Library). **NOTE:** There is a process for donating books to the library. You must bring your own books in, and complete a donation form. Books must still have the sticker or stamp with your name and SID #. If books come into the library with a name crossed out, we will try to identify the owner and return it to that person. Books that have no identification and are not library books will be recycled.

**\*State Clothing** won't count towards the space of your roll up because they go to the Clothing Room but you are still

responsible for them and the protection of your clothes and personal items from theft and damage.

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### ***SODA AND JUICE IN THE VISITING ROOM***

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Due to some concerns over the pop/juice bottles in the visiting rooms, we have had to change the way we recycle the pop/juice bottles. Within the medium visiting room, this is the new process for us to be able to recycle the bottles. You will have your family empty pop/juice bottle out into the white five gallon bucket, throw the bottle cap in the trash can, and the pop/juice bottle in the bottle recycle can. Please help this new process along to ensure we recycle all items we can.

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### ***ADL HELP WANTED***

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Are you looking for a new job? Are you a kind, caring, compassionate person? Are you looking for a way to help others and give back? Are you respectful and responsible? CCCF is currently accepting applications for ADL Worker positions. Activities of daily living (ADL's) are day to day activities like walking or pushing a wheelchair, bathing, dressing, feeding, and toileting that some inmates may not be able to do on their own; they require assistance.

In order to be considered for this position you must be housed in the Medium facility, cannot live on MHU, have 6 months clear conduct and no program failures in the last 6 months.

You must also have at least one year remaining of your sentence, and be physically able to lift with no medical restrictions. We are looking for individuals who communicate well with others, are patient, and respect the need for confidentiality.

If you are interested in an ADL Worker position, pick up and complete an Inmate Work Application on your unit. Address your completed application to Health Services Nurse Manager and submit by placing in the Health Services kyle box on your unit. Applications received will be screened by Inmate Work Programs (IWP). Applicants who meet the minimum qualifications will be scheduled and called out for an interview. Thanks for your interest.

**About The IF Project**

We are a collaboration of Law Enforcement, currently and previously incarcerated adults and community partners focused on intervention, prevention and reduction in incarceration and recidivism. Our work is built upon — and inspired by — people sharing their personal experiences surrounding the issues of incarceration. This project is based on the question:

**If there was something someone could have said or done that would have changed the path that led you here, what would it have been?**
