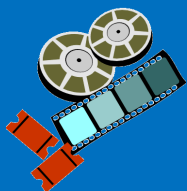

The inmate's sack lunch will be provided. Each sack lunch will include the following: 2 sandwiches, chips, cookies, and raw veggies. Drinks will also be provided.

- Please send an approved CD28 for the total amount (\$2.00 for each person in your visiting party that needs a sack lunch) with account #2637 communication to Mr. Vokral at box #B343. Please insure all CD28's are legible.
- Visitors must be on your current approved list, the complete names of the visitors attending must be listed on an attached to communication form to M. Vokral.
- Please do not sign up if you are on LOP, incentive level 1, or on basic visiting status
- Refunds will not be given to those inmates that are unable to attend due to their own actions or if visitors do not attend
- Make sure your signature is verified on your CD28 by a Correctional Officer
- Adults in custody who have not attended the previous lunch will be given priority to attend this upcoming lunch.
- Communications with CD28's must be received no later than May 4th 2017
- The first 55 inmates that meet the above criteria will be able to attend this event
- Inmates that have NOT attended prior luncheons and meet the above criteria will be offered a higher priority in attending this event
- Visitors are encouraged to arrive prior to 10:30 am to attend luncheon to allow adequate time to be processed into the event. Although the Department of Corrections understands that circumstances occasionally arise that may hinder your families' arrival. Please advise them if they are going to be delayed past the 10:30 am time they should contact the Institution. This will assist the Officer in Charge to make other arrangements if necessary to make their visit enjoyable.

Story Link Book Reading for Family

Story Link will allow qualifying Adults in Custody to read to an immediate family member (child or grandchild). Volunteers will bring an assortment of books to choose from and then record Adults in Custody reading a story which is burned to a CD. The Book and CD will be sent to the family. – NO COST to the inmate.

Dates:

- Complex 1, April 25, 2017
- Complex 2, May 30, 2017
- Complex 3, June 27, 2017

Qualifications:

- An inmate with a No Contact Order (NCO) is strictly prohibited from sending the book and recording to anyone within the NCO.
- The proposed recipient must be between the ages of 2 and 14.
- The proposed recipient must be on the inmate's approved visiting list.
- The proposed recipient must be the inmate's child, grandchild, step-child, or step-grandchild.
- The inmate must be incentive level 2 or 3.
- There are no exceptions to these qualifications.

Procedures:

- Choose one book to read and send to your family. If you have more than one child, you may select a book that all will enjoy. Only one book and recording may be sent.
- Readings will be limited to six (6) minutes. You will also be able to record a one (1) minute message to your child/grandchild. If you choose a chapter book, you will still be limited to this time frame.
- DO NOT send Inmate Communication Forms asking for specific books. The books are donated and book boxes are divided into the following ages: 2-4, 5-6, 7-10, and 11-14. You will be able to select a book from those provided.
- When you come to read your book you will need to bring the name and address of the person you are sending the recording to – this is VERY important.

To Sign Up:

Send an application from the housing unit to Mr. M. Galemore, Box B343, letting him know that you would like to participate. The application form MUST include: name of the child you will be reading to AND the name of the parents/guardian that will be receiving the recording. Applications are being accepted. - League Participation
- Holiday LOP-Level 1 no lifting of holiday LOP, Level 2 lifting of LOP actual holiday, Level 3 lifting of LOP for entire holiday.

- Outside Food Events

Education Minute

This week's topic: Going to College Upon Release?

Are you planning to go to college (or back to college) when you release? Do you know what you need to do to accomplish that? A few things to keep in mind:

- If you have outstanding student loan debt, you'll need to get back in good standing to be eligible for FAFSA.
- If you are going back to a college you attended before incarceration and have outstanding debt with them, you will have to resolve that before you can register for new classes.
- Education has paper applications for most Oregon community colleges, as well as current FAFSA forms.
- The process of applying for college and getting finances in order takes time, so don't procrastinate until the last minute.
- If you will attend a new college and have credits with another college, you can request that your official transcripts be sent to the new college - this typically has a fee. Education can provide transcript request forms if needed.
