When Behavior Affects Your

If your PRAS Award is less than expected, one reason may be some kind of misconduct you received during the month. Based on ORS 291-077-0033, the Performance Recognition and Award System (PRAS), you may receive less PRAS points than you expect if you have any kind of disciplinary report in the same month.

- ❑ **Daily Failures:** You will not receive PRAS points for that day.
- ❑ **Program Failures:** You will not receive PRAS points for that day and any days afterwards.
- ❑ **Misconduct Reports:** You will lose a portion of the PRAS points you already earned for the month of the write-up based upon the severity of your misconduct. You will lose from 10%-100% of your monthly points for each misconduct received.

Behavioral Adjustment as follows

- ❑ The department will record all inmate disciplinary sanction orders and adjust downward the inmate's monthly performance points based on the level of misconduct assigned to the disciplinary rule violation(s) by the corresponding inmate disciplinary grid(s) contained in the department's rule on Prohibited Inmate Conduct and Processing Disciplinary Actions (OAR 291-105). For each disciplinary order sanctioning an inmate for a disciplinary rule violation, the department will deduct points from an inmate's monthly performance points based on the level of misconduct as follows:
 - (A) Level 1 -- 100% Deducted.
 - (B) Level 2 -- 80% Deducted.
 - (C) Level 3 -- 65% Deducted.
 - (D) Level 4 -- 40% Deducted.
 - (E) Level 5 -- 20% Deducted.
 - (F) Level 6 -- 10% Deducted.
 - ❑ Deductions for behavioral adjustment will be made in the month in which the final disciplinary order is issued in the disciplinary case. Monthly performance points with behavioral adjustments will be calculated by taking the monthly performance points, subtracting for behavioral adjustments to determine the total monthly performance points.

My name is Forest Moomey, age 30. My journey started with a felony drug conviction in 2007 with a 36 month suspended sentence. My continuous criminal thinking and "I do what I want" attitude led me to absconding in 2009 to Hawaii. I was there for about six years and within that time made changes in my life but I still needed to come back to Oregon to take care of the warrant if I wanted to be with my family again.

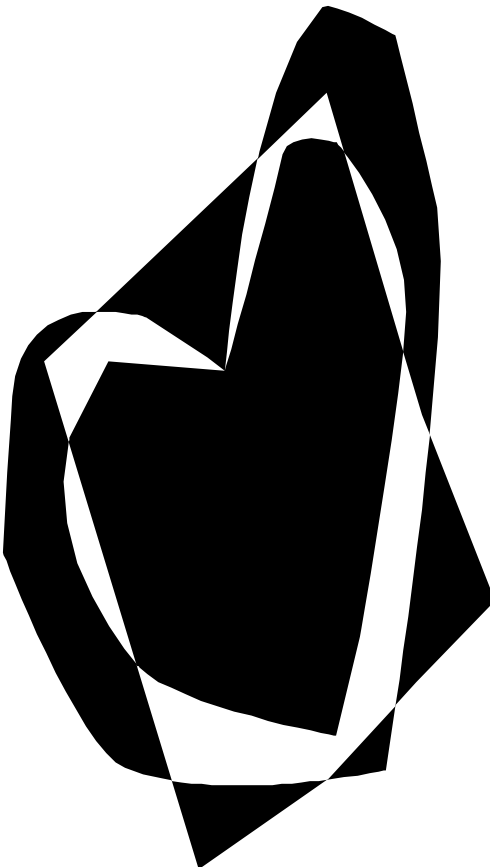
After coming to Powder River I was excited to get into the program so I could get out soon but I was worried that I may loose who I was or worse fail the program. G.P outreach helped shake those thoughts and reinforced willingness for change and succeed.

When I got into A.I.P I immediately noticed how kind and helpful everyone was. Life was quite different from general population and I quickly fell in love with it.

The time with my counselor and treatment plans really helped me learn about myself and what I needed to gain strength and change. In this I've learned about boundaries, who to let or what to let into my life or not. I've learned what the traits of codependency are and the difference between enabling, caretaking and helping others. Saying NO and being assertive was one of the hardest to work on but it can save a life.

My changes are seen by my family and I really notice a big difference. By having healthy relationships, setting healthy boundaries and being pro-social in sobriety, I am confident with my learned tools I will be an A.I.P success and have a fruitful life changing humbling experience. Because of A.I.P I now truly know myself.
