Lifting of Restrictions

Loss of Privileges will be lifted as follows for the New Year Holiday – starting at 8:00 am on Saturday, December 31, 2016 and ending at 10:00 pm on Monday, January 2, 2017.

- Level 1 no lifting of holiday LOP
- Level 2 lifting of LOP on actual holiday only
- Level 3 lifting of LOP for entire holiday weekend.

Privileges restricted by an Inmate Management Plan issued by the Security Threat Management Unit are not lifted during Holiday periods. These restrictions remain in effect and are enforced until the date specified on the Inmate Management Plan. This does not restrict normal operations and progressive discipline, such as cell-ins or transfer to segregation for poor behavior that may be seen as a threat to others and/or the safety and security of the institution.

Story Link Book Reading for Family


Story Link is a project where program volunteers bring in an assortment of children's books, which qualifying Adults in Custody (AIC) can choose from; they read the stories to an immediate family member (child or grandchild), it is transferred on to a CD and the book and CD are sent to the family member. This program is facilitated at no cost to the inmates who choose to participate and is a great way to share story time with children while they are at home.

Dates:

Complex 1, January 24, 2017
Complex 2, February (Date to be determined)
Complex 3, March (Date to be determined)

Qualifications:

- Must be participant's (AIC) child or grandchild, between the ages of 2 and 14 years old.
- The family member receiving the CD and book must be on the participants approved visiting list.



Procedures:

- Participants may choose only one book to be recorded and sent to their family – it can be individualized to one child, or if you have more than one child the book may be read/recorded for all of them, but you can only do one book.
- Readings will be limited to six (6) minutes. You will also be able to record a one (1) minute message to your child/grandchild. If you choose a chapter book, you will still be limited to this time frame.
- DO NOT send kyte forms asking for specific books. The books are donated and book boxes are divided into the following ages: 2-4, 5-6, 7-10, and 11-14. You will be able to select a book from those provided.
- When you come to read your book you will need to bring the name and address of the person you are sending the recording to – this is VERY important.

To Sign Up:

- Send an inmate communication form to Mr. M. Galemore letting him know that you would like to participate. Mr. Galemore will send you a Story Link Application. The application must be filled out in its entirety or it will be returned without being processed.
- The inmate communication form must be filled out in its entirety or it will be returned without being processed.

The Story Link Application MUST include: name of the child you will be reading to AND the name of the parents/guardian that will be receiving the recording. Applications must accepted no later than January 18th, 2017 for Complex One.

So what is *Parenting Inside Out*?

Are you a parent? Do you want to be apart of something positive for yourself and your child? Do you want to learn new skills to improve our relationship with your child?

If this describes you, please **join us** for **Parenting Inside Out (PIO)**.

PIO is a voluntary, **108 hour** program offered **3 days a week for 12 weeks**. You will learn a variety of **positive** parenting techniques you can use during your incarceration and after you return to your community.

Through interactive coaching, role-plays, journaling and discussion, you will expand your understanding of, and practice, skills in:

- Emotion regulation to help you manage your behavior in difficult situations.
- Listening and Speaking in a way that draws your child closer.
- Child development: what to expect at different ages and stages.
- Effective communication and problem solving.
- Positive encouragement and praise.
- Child safety and health.
- Common parenting problems and what to do about them.
- Healthy adult relationships.
- Preparing for the transition home.
