Repurposing Wool Blankets



When SRCI decided to replace all of the institution's wool blankets, Maria Rodriguez, OCE Production Coordinator, and the OCE Laundry Sewing Certification workers suggested they could repurpose some of the used wool blankets into ponchos and hand warmers to be donated to the local homeless outreach center. The SRCI Administration and the Staff & Community Partnership Committee agreed to the idea. This project took approximately 6 weeks to complete and as a result we delivered 170 ponchos & 170 hand warmers to the New Hope Kitchen in Ontario. The timing was really appreciated because a few days before the donation the Ontario area was hit with one of many snow storms this winter followed by extreme cold and ice buildup which caused several homeless encampments near the river to be flooded.

Thank you to our Sewing Certification Program workers whose sewing capabilities are utilized highly throughout our institution. These ponchos and hand warmers were delivered on January 23rd to New Hope Kitchen in Ontario.

C2 Industries Janitor Opening

C2 Industries has one opening for a Janitor.

This position is responsible for general cleaning duties in the C2 Industries (BCT) classrooms, corridors, and shop areas. The successful candidate will be exposed to wood dust and debris on a daily basis and must be able to work in such an environment. Some heavy lifting may be necessary.

Requirements:

- GED/High School Diploma Preferred - may be enrolled in GED classes and working toward completion.
- Must be in the ODOC system for at least six (6) months and at SRCI at least 30 days.
- Have a minimum of two years left on your sentence.
- DR & program failure free for a minimum of one year.
- Must be assigned to general population.
- Must live in Complex 2 or be willing to move to Complex 2 when hired.
- Must work well with BCT students, workers and TVCC staff.
- Preference given to those who have completed the Custodial Procedures training.
- Required completion of the course within 3 months of hire.

- Please do not sign up if you are on LOP, incentive level 1, or on basic visiting status.
- Refunds will not be given to those inmates that are unable to attend due to their own actions or if visitors do not attend.
- Make sure your signature is verified on your CD28 by a Correctional Officer.
- Communications with CD28's must be received no later than February 22nd.
- The first 55 inmates that meet the above criteria will be able to attend this event.
- Visitors are encouraged to arrive prior to 10:30 am to attend luncheon to allow adequate time to be processed into the event. Although the Department of Corrections understands that circumstances occasionally arise that may hinder your families' arrival. Please advise them if they are going to be delayed past the 10:30 am time they should contact the Institution. This will assist the Officer in Charge to make other arrangements if necessary to make their visit enjoyable.
- As always we are considering ideas to enhance the luncheon, if there are ideas out there please add them to the inmate communication that is submitted.
