Outstanding Student Loans/Default Resolution

Do you have outstanding student loans from before your arrest? Education can offer assistance in contacting Department of Education and/or your loan servicer to explore options. Many students have been able to arrange to make manageable payments or have their loans placed in deferred or forbearance status while incarcerated. Remember that forbearance and deferral aren't always the best option, and those statuses often have an annual renewal requirement. If you plan to continue your education and apply for Federal financial aid upon release, it's better to tackle the problem head-on and resolve it than get out and have that be an obstacle in the way of your continued education!

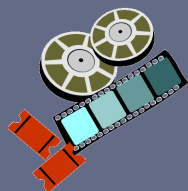

Cancelled Shoe Orders:

Due to an error in the posting of the shoe form, shoe orders may not have been properly filled out with correct prices. All shoe orders from April 21 - April 26, 2017 that were placed incorrectly have been canceled. You will receive an automated response stating

"This form was not properly filled out. This order has been cancelled. Please submit a new order with all of the correct options selected. Typing what you want in the summary without selecting the options on the form will result in your order being cancelled."

If you receive the automated message, please resubmit your shoe order on or after April 26, 2017 with your correct shoe, size and **price as it appears in the catalog**. If you do not receive an automated message, your order has been processed; please do not place another order.

Two-Year Renewals

Inmate Services Unit (ISU) technicians are completing a visitor clean-up project by completing background reviews on all visitors 15 years and older that have been on your visiting list for two years or longer. Additionally, per Oregon Administrative Rule 291-127-0285 on Visiting (Inmate), any visitor that hasn't visited in the previous **two years** will be removed from the inmate's list unless ISU is notified otherwise.

We ask that you consider **waiting until your visitor is ready to visit** before adding them back to your list. Our visiting application process is very streamlined, so we can complete most applications within a week of receipt unless there is some background issue. This will also help keep your visiting list updated and accurate, and ensure new applications continue to be processed as quickly as possible.

What this means:

1. On May 15, 2017, any visitor that has not visited in the past two years will be automatically removed from your visiting list.
2. You will receive notifications of visitors that are removed. Again, we recommend you reapply when your visitor is ready to visit.
3. ISU Technicians will focus on completing background checks on all visitors on your visiting list for two years or longer, who are still visiting.
4. You will be notified if a visitor is found to no longer be eligible to visit.
5. The Inmate Services Unit knows how important it is for you to connect with your family and friends, mentors, and support. We want to help make this clean-up project as smooth as possible, so please share this information with your visitors.
