

Prison Rape Elimination Act

The **Prison Rape Elimination Act** (PREA) of 2003 is a federal law that seeks to eliminate sexual abuse and harassment. This law applies to all federal and state prisons, jails, police lock-ups, private facilities, juvenile facilities, and community correctional settings.

DOC rules prohibit any form of sexual activity, including sexual harassment. Forced or coerced sexual behavior is a criminal offense and the department will take every action possible to hold perpetrators accountable.

The Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) has a zero-tolerance towards sexual abuse and will actively investigate all allegations of sexual abuse. It is very important that all incidents are reported so the victim can receive the help they need and so the department can stop the chain of abuse.

Ways to Report Sex Abuse, Sexual Harassment, Sexual Solicitation, Sexual Coercion, or Voyeurism

You must write "official mail" on the envelope to ensure it is not inspected by staff if you wish to remain anonymous. Please indicate that it is a PREA allegation at the beginning of the letter and you will need to request to remain anonymous for the Governor's Office to do so. They will refer all allegations to the DOC PREA coordinator to assure a investigation is completed based off the information that is provided.

What happens if I report?

Should you experience sexual abuse or sexual harassment we strongly encourage you to report it as soon as possible. Doing so will help us with the investigation; however, we will investigate all cases, regardless of when you report.

Once you report a case of sexual abuse or sexual harassment, the first thing that happens comes out of concern for your safety. We will separate you from the alleged abuser to ensure that no further harm is done.

A member of your institution's Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) will briefly interview you and ask you some very basic questions and direct you towards services offered (BHS and Health Services). This information will then be forwarded on and may result in an investigation by the Oregon State Police and/or the Special Investigations Unit. Based on the findings of this investigation, alleged abusers can face anything from administrative sanctions to criminal charges.

DOC is committed to making our facilities a safer place.

PREA Advocate (Support) Program

The Department of Corrections has a Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) Advocate available for inmates who are victims of sexual abuse and need support. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, you may have to cope with challenges you never expected to face. You may be overwhelmed by fear and emotions, not knowing what to do next or where to turn for help.

You can call the DOC PREA Advocate for support and resource services. Simply dial your PIN on the inmate telephone system followed by "711." Calls to this number are free of charge. When leaving a message, please leave your name, SID # and a brief description of what you would like to speak about with the DOC PREA Advocate. The DOC PREA Advocate will schedule a return call to you through institution staff within two to three business days. Please note: The DOC PREA Advocate is an employee and is required to report allegations of sexual abuse. This number does not replace the current DOC PREA reporting hotline that is available by dialing 9 on the inmate telephone system.

In the future we plan to have community-based advocacy groups deliver confidential support services for inmates who wish to speak with someone regarding sexual abuse. This will allow inmates who are victims of sexual abuse to access support services even if they have not reported sexual abuse to DOC. We will communicate to you when the outside advocacy program develops. At that time your phone call to "711" will put you in touch with the outside advocates' telephone numbers.

The "711" line is only for issues related to sexual abuse. Anyone repeatedly misusing the line or anyone who threatens or harasses an advocate may be disciplined.

Telephone calls and mail may be monitored by DOC in accordance with the Inmate Telephone (291-130) and Mail (291-131) rules.

Who else can I talk to?

The Oregon Department of Corrections is committed to providing inmates with avenues to seek assistance. The following contact information is from local, state, and national victim advocacy or rape crisis organizations. Incentive Level Overrides

SCCI offers incentive level overrides to inmates who have demonstrated that they can maintain clear conduct while at Level 2 at this institution.

The following is information about when inmates are eligible for override consideration.

Incentive Level Override Minimum Standards:

- At Level 2 for at least 3 months.
- Housed at SCCI for a minimum of 3 months
- No Conduct Orders in the last 3 months
- No Misconduct Reports in the last 6 months
- No Program Failures in the last 3 months

If you meet all of these requirements, you may request an override by sending an inmate communication form to Ms. Martin in Administration. Once the request for override is received, your history will be reviewed, and a determination will be made on your override status.

RE: Telmate Phone Refunds

Below is the process Central Trust follows to reimburse individuals that have balances on their Telmate phone account when they are released from the custody of the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC).

Central Trust receives refund checks from Telmate for those who have released from DOC with a telephone account balance. Central Trust currently receives these checks approximately 10 days after Telmate's reconciliation cut-off dates, which occur on the 15th and the last day of each month. The Telmate refund will be deposited, less a \$5.00 processing fee, into your trust account.

If you have an Oregon Trail Card, all remaining funds in your trust account are forwarded to your Oregon Trail Card.

If you do not have an Oregon Trail Card and have submitted a form to release funds to a particular person, a check will be made out to that person and sent to the address listed on the funds release form.

If you do not have an Oregon Trail Card and have not submitted a form to release funds, Central Trust will contact your Parole/Probation Officer in an attempt to send you the remaining balance.

If you are not on Post-Prison Supervision and do not have an Oregon Trail Card, you are responsible for notifying Central Trust, in writing, where you would like your refund check sent.

Please contact your Release Counselor with any questions.

NOTICE:

Central Trust will not generate a refund check if the amount remaining in your trust account is less than one dollar.

When a friend or family member makes a deposit using Telmate and then later disputes those charges, a fraud flag is placed onto your Telmate account. Telmate will not accept credit or debit card transactions to your prepaid Telmate phone account or process deposits into your inmate trust account until the dispute is resolved.

The only person who is able to resolve a credit card dispute is the person who owns the card used in the disputed transaction. They must resolve the dispute with their credit card issuer/bank and Telmate. Telmate customer service can be contacted at 866-516-0115.

Your friends and family may make deposits to your account at any Telmate deposit kiosk with cash.

Additionally, there are currently two other vendors that process credit & debit card transactions (Inmate Trust Account). These vendors are JPay and Access Corrections.

Friends and family also have the choice to mail a money order to Central Trust.

Subject: Holiday Debt Collection Suspension

- The 2016 holiday buying period runs Monday, November 28, 2016 through Friday, December 30, 2016.
- Spending limits will be doubled during the holiday buying period.
- **If you are INDEBTED read this:** Debt will be collected through November 23, prior to the beginning of the holiday buying period. DOC is exercising the discretion of the Assistant Director of Operations, according to Trust rule 291-158-0065 to designate November 23 as the last business day of the month, prior to the holiday buying period.
- During the holiday buying period, Central Trust will not collect existing DOC debt. However, non-DOC debt, such as court fees and garnishment orders, will be collected during the buying period, as well as fines associated with new disciplinary sanctions that are applied to your trust account.
- During the holiday buying period, inmates who are indebted to the DOC may only spend funds posted to their account for postage, copies, institution club activities, and commissary items.
- If you are indebted, Central Trust will not process CD-28s to send funds out.
- At the conclusion of the holiday buying period, any funds remaining in accounts of indebted inmates will be collected and applied to their debt.

NOTE: Inmate Re-Entry Savings Accounts (IRSA) deductions will also be suspended during this time (applies to inmates housed at PRCF only).

Telmate Kyte Pilot

Starting November 1, 2016, you will be able to request help for your PRAS and canteen questions via the Telmate tablets. Access is located within the "Free" portion of the system under **Help**.

There is a folder called Trust/Canteen Help. In that folder you will compose a detailed email explaining your concerns/questions regarding your issue. The folder will be monitored and a response will be posted to your account within a few days. This folder is just for Trust and Canteen help. **DO NOT** submit multiple requests regarding the same issue; multiple requests will be Closed without a response.

SCCI MAILROOM PROCESS

We have taken steps to decrease the number of mail violations and returned letters in the following ways:

If you receive a card or letter with attachments such as stickers, tape, or other attachments or embellishments that can be removed without destroying the card/envelope, we will remove those items and send the envelope/card in for delivery rather than rejecting or violating the entire piece of mail and returning it to the sender. If an attachment is removed, we will provide a note indicating its removal so that you may notify the sender that these items are not allowed.

If crayon drawings or other things such as post-it notes that are against the mail rule are mailed in, we will attempt to make a photo copy (color if necessary) of the item for delivery to you with a notice that the original item is not approved and that you need to let the sender know that these items are not allowed. We will also provide you with a notice giving you 30 days to either provide an envelope for mailing the item back or giving staff the permission to hot trash the item.

Rejected Books, Magazines, and other Publication “freebies” like CD’s: If you receive an item that is rejected, we will provide you with a notice giving you 30 days to either provide an envelope or CD28 for mailing the item home or back to the publisher for a refund or giving us permission to hot trash the item. Please let your family and friends know to check the mail rule on the DOC webpage - www.oregon.gov/DOC/ - under the link Family and Friends on the left hand side of the page. It is your responsibility to notify your correspondents of the mail rules. To provide further assistance, if you wish to check if a certain book is on the rejection list, you may contact Ms. Paluch in Administration prior to ordering. Please limit your request to 5 books per kyte per week.

Mailing in of Picture Reprints: At this time, we will not be changing our practice of allowing friends/families to send in picture reprints for your use in corresponding with other individuals. However, picture reprints are not to be shared in the dorms or distributed to other inmates except as allowed in the mail rule. Please also remember that any photos must meet the mail rule standards for content and envelope thickness.

Monday, November 28th Holiday Buying Period Starts




