PREA Reports

Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA Information)

The Oregon Department of Corrections (ODOC) has a zero tolerance policy for sexual abuse, sexual harassment and for retaliation for reporting an incident. You may report in person to any staff, through an inmate communication, through the grievance system, by calling the PREA hotline by dialing 9 from any inmate phone.

Filing an Anonymous PREA Report

If you are uneasy about filing a PREA allegation, you may file an anonymous report with an outside agency.

Please indicate in the beginning of your letter you are filing a PREA allegation and you are requesting to remain anonymous. The Governor’s Office will refer all anonymous allegations to the DOC PREA Coordinator to assure an investigation is completed based off the information that is provided.

Community-Based PREA Advocacy (Support) Program

ODOC has partnered with community based, confidential advocates of sexual abuse victims to provide services to inmates.

Inmates at ODOC who have experienced sexual abuse may reach a community-based advocate by dialing 711 inmate telephone systems, or may request a private call through the PREA Compliance Manager at the facility. Advocates provide victims of sexual abuse information about their options, resources, information and emotional support. There is no charge for calls to advocates.

Role of an Advocate:

- Provide confidential support and crisis intervention
- Inform you about the investigation and medical examination process
- Educate you about healing from sexual abuse
- Offer resources and referrals

Advocates will:

- Not tell you what to do
- Not communicate with the institution unless you request them to do so and sign a release
- Not provide legal advice

Community-based advocacy centers provide sexual abuse support to people of all genders. Community-based advocates will not report unless you request them to do so and if you sign a release of information.

DOC is committed to providing inmates with avenues to seek assistance. Below are additional resources:

20.211.00.043 Game of Thrones – Book 1

In *A Game of Thrones*, George R. R. Martin has created a genuine masterpiece, bringing together the best the genre has to offer. Mystery, intrigue, romance, and adventure fill the pages of the first volume in an epic series sure to delight fantasy fans everywhere. In a land where summers can last decades and winters a lifetime, trouble is brewing. The cold is returning, and in the frozen wastes to the North of Winterfell, sinister and supernatural forces are massing beyond the kingdom's protective Wall. At the center of the conflict lie the Starks of Winterfell, a family as harsh and unyielding as the land they were born to. Canteen

Soda Coupons – if you have arrived here from another institution and have soda coupons – You will have to send them back to the institution that issued them, with your **original receipt**.

Only **1** slip per week allowed. I will not make changes to any form.

You ***must write legibly*** your legal name, no nicknames, shortened names, or monikers on all canteen forms.

If you make a mistake on your canteen slip, here is the **proper procedure**:

1. Fill out a corrected canteen slip
2. Have it verified
3. Fill out a kyte explaining the issue
4. Put the canteen slip in with a kyte
5. Place the kyte in the kyte box (NOT canteen)

The kyte must reach me by the due date of the order you are trying to correct.

Slips are due ***Monday night mail line*** unless posted differently. Since all slips are shipped to Salem for processing, once it leaves WCCF, I cannot stop it.

If NWC has not processed your order I may be able to cancel that order if you let me know, otherwise your order will be processed and you will be responsible for it.

It usually takes NWC at least 5 to 7 days to fill your orders. I am unable to credit inmate accounts for incentive items. If you order items on the kiosk, you may not refuse them. The kiosk states that all sales are final.

If you have a large order, it is permissible to bring a clean laundry bag to haul it back to the unit. Unless previously authorized it is never acceptable for another inmate to have your items, even for carrying purposes.

Please to remember if you **staple** your slip:

- A. **One staple only**
- B. **Staple to the back of the canteen form**
- C. **Do not staple the form if it is folded**
- D. **Upper left hand corner is the best area for stapling**
- E. **All slips must be verified with staff initials**

If you have any questions feel free to contact me via kyte.

Please place all kytes in the kyte box. I only check the canteen box once weekly so I may not get to your question until then. Also this way I have computer access to assist me in questions regarding your account. I have no access to the inmate kiosks to verify orders. If you have questions about an order please include your kiosk confirmation number and I will forward to NWC for investigation.

It is never permissible to come to canteen without being called. Please have your unit officers verify it is ok to come down if you are out of rotation.

If you have placed an order you **must** come to canteen to retrieve it. If you fail to come to canteen with your unit or work/programming, progressive discipline will be instituted starting with a 4 hour cell in.

Horse play or touching is absolutely prohibited in Canteen.

Please come dressed appropriately, no shorts, flip flops, sandals shoes etc.

When you are in the canteen hallway: Hats must be removed, no sunglasses, and coats must be open. Please remain quiet while waiting for your orders, it is very busy and hard to hear when everyone is talking.

Upcoming Changes to the Commissary Forms:

Due to some operational changes and suggestions we received from the adults in custody, we have made some changes to the commissary form. These forms will be out soon.

Holiday Section

We have removed the holiday section from the backside of the commissary form. We will use a separate form for holidays.

Greeting Cards Section

We have removed the list of cards and provided space for you to write in the event, age, and gender of the card you want.

For example: Birthday, youth, male

Alternative Canteen Form

We will no longer use a separate form for alternative items. These items have been added to the backside of the commissary form.

Promotional and Holiday Items

We have heard you loud and clear regarding the lack of opportunity to purchase promotional/holiday items.

Beginning with this summer promotional period (July-September), Commissary will limit purchase quantities until everyone has had equal opportunity to purchase these items.

The limits will be clearly marked on the commissary form. Please note, these limits may change periodically depending on supply and demand.

You have likely heard the news about a recent lawsuit claiming that DOC's food services does not meet specific standards. We cannot comment on the claims in that lawsuit, but we can provide some general information.

DOC is committed to providing safe and wholesome meals. We know that you care about your food, and we care about you! We also know that the quality of our food has a direct impact on your health and attitude, and the overall climate of our facilities.

We operate our Food Services Program by following Oregon Administrative Rule Division 61 – Food Services Programs. This rule provides guidelines for:

- Food safety
- Wholesomeness of food
- Storage and transportation of food
- Food preparation and cooking
- Food serving
- Inspections

This rule is available online and at each DOC institution. We encourage any of you with questions about the quality of DOC's food to review this rule.

DOC uses standard, statewide menus based on United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) guidelines and recommended daily

nutrients and calories. The same meals are made available to staff at each of DOC's 14 institutions.

DOC is committed to adhering to the highest possible standards in providing meal service to you and our staff.

Wildlife Disease and Management

On Tuesday, June 20th at 9:00 AM in Rooms C45/46, Joe Porter, Wildlife Biologist with the Lakeview BLM will speak about wildlife pathogens.

He will highlight some of the pathogens that are current "big-ticket" issues in the United States (especially the West and Oregon).

Mr. Porter will give background information on the pathogens, discuss what implications they have on the species, management, and society and what we can do to combat them.

News from Inmate Services

Two-Year Renewals

Inmate Services Unit (ISU) technicians are completing a visitor clean-up project by completing background reviews on all visitors 15 years and older that have been on your visiting list for two years or longer. Additionally, per Oregon Administrative Rule 291-127-0285 on Visiting (Inmate), any visitor that hasn't visited in the previous two years will be removed from the inmate's list unless ISU is notified otherwise.

We ask that you consider waiting until your visitor is ready to visit before adding them back to your list. Our visiting application process is very streamlined, so we can complete most applications within a week of receipt unless there is some background issue. This will also help keep your visiting list updated and accurate, and ensure new applications continue to be processed as quickly as possible.

What this means:

1. On May 15, 2017, any visitor that has not visited in the past two years will be automatically removed from your visiting list.
2. You will receive notifications of visitors that are removed. Again, we recommend you reapply when your visitor is ready to visit.
3. ISU Technicians will focus on completing background checks on all visitors on your visiting list for two years or longer, who are still visiting.

4. You will be notified if a visitor is found to no longer be eligible to visit.

The Inmate Services Unit knows how important it is for you to connect with your family and friends, mentors, and support. We want to help make this clean-up project as smooth as possible, so please share this information with your visitors.
