The Rotary Club may consider assisting with transportation costs and/or needed hotel lodging for caregivers traveling long distances (75 Miles+) to bring children to this event. Assistance will be reviewed and approved on a case-by-case basis. Please do not request this assistance unless it is **absolutely** necessary. Applications are available in the housing units for you to fill out and send to your family members.

Applications are due to Ms. Tabert no later than **June 8**. Late applications will not be accepted/processed.

If you are approved for this event, you will receive a notification with a list of guests who are also approved. You will also be sent invitations to send to your guests who are approved. **Due to space limitations, we will be determining the number of caregivers allowed to come in based on the number of children that are approved for the event.**

POSTAGE SCALES

From DOC

Postage Scales

Effective May 2018, the Department will begin providing scales to the Adult in Custody population. The purpose of these scales are to provide AICs with a resource to ensure that they are utilizing the appropriate envelope with the appropriate amount of postage when mailing out letters and packages.

The locations of the scales will be determined by each institution's Functional Unit Manager.

Postage charts will be placed by each scale that provide information regarding the available options which are purchasable through the commissary.

Please note that the mailroom will not process letters and packages that have a CD28 attached after May 1, 2018.

Legal Exceptions

CD28s will be authorized to be attached to legal mail and sent out *through legal libraries only*. For general legal mail that does not meet the criteria of priority legal mail, there must be sufficient funds in the AIC's trust account in order to use a CD28. AICs will not be authorized to incur debt unless the letter or package has been identified and stamped priority legal by the appropriate staff.

Priority legal mail consists of filings and legal documents required in legal challenges related to an inmate's conviction of sentence or prison conditions. See OAR 291-139-0110 (13) Priority Legal User.

Head Start is a national program established in 1965 to promote healthy prenatal outcomes, enhance the development of young children and promote healthy family functioning. The mission of the Head Start program at Coffee Creek is to promote, strengthen, and support bonding and attachment between children and their incarcerated mothers.

Requirements:

- Child aged birth-5
- Minimum or minimum eligible with gate clearance
- Child lives less than 60 minutes away
- Transportation to and from the school every Tues/Thurs 9:00-12:30

BIRTH CERTIFICATES AND SOCIAL SECURITY CARDS

From DOC

Many already know how important it is to have your birth certificate and social security card, but it's worth repeating and even "kyting" about. Aside from the benefits of having

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your birth certificate while you're still inside, both pieces of identification are essential to your success after release because they are needed to get a job, open a bank account or cast a check, and apply for state or military benefits.

As you approach your release, if the DOC does not have a birth certificate or social security card on file for you and if you may be eligible to receive one provided by the DOC, you will receive a kyte from the institution records office. Those approaching age 65 will also be sent a kyte if the DOC does not have a birth certificate on record. The kyte will tell you which piece of identification is missing and give you the means to start the application process. Just fill in the information and forward the kyte to your institution records office. It's as simple as that!

NOTE: To eliminate duplications that could delay your application process, please complete and return only one each of the birth certificate and social security card kyte forms.
