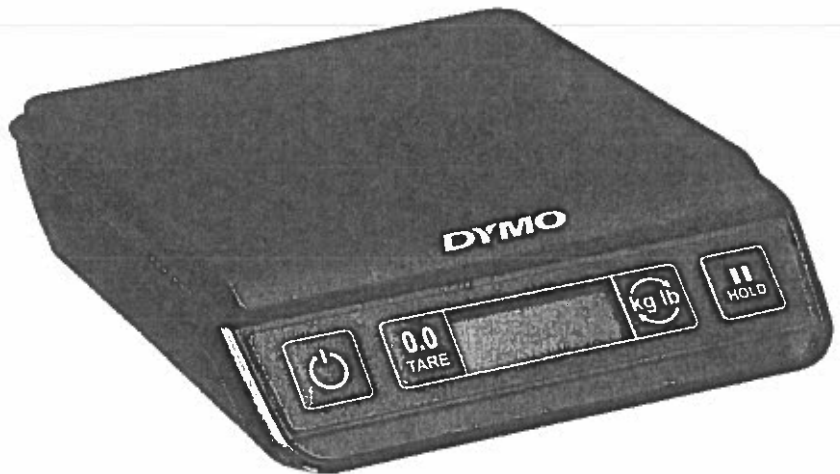
## PRCF Commissary Processing and Distribution

SRCI Commissary will be offering Double Spending for PRCF General Population the week of June 18 – 22, due to the Commissary shutdown for the Year End Inventory that is scheduled for June 25 – 29. PRCF Double Spending distribution will be June 28, 2018. **No Commissary distribution the week of July 5, 2018.** SRCI Commissary will resume normal processing of PRCF canteen the week of July 5, with those orders being distributed July 12, 2018.

## Postage Scales

Effective June 2018, the Department will begin providing scales to the Adult in Custody population. The purpose of these scales are to provide AICs with a resource to ensure that they are uti-



lizing the appropriate envelope with the appropriate amount of postage when mailing out letters and packages.

The locations of the scales will be determined by each institution's Functional Unit Manager.

Postage charts will be placed by each scale that provide information regarding the available options which are purchasable through the commissary.

Please note that the mailroom will not process letters and packages that have a CD28 attached after June, 2018.

## Legal Exceptions

CD28s will be authorized to be attached to legal mail and sent out *through legal libraries only*. For general legal mail that does not meet the criteria of priority legal mail, there must be sufficient funds in the AIC's trust account in order to use a CD28. AICs will not be authorized to incur debt unless the letter or package has been identified and stamped priority legal by the appropriate staff.

Priority legal mail consists of filings and legal documents required in legal challenges related to an inmate's conviction of sentence or prison conditions. See OAR 291-139-0110 (13) Priority Legal User.

### **A note from the Inmate Services Unit (ISU)**

If a loved one has not visited in the past two years, they will automatically be removed from your approved visiting list. ISU is requesting you wait until they are ready to visit again before you submit another application. Application process time is typically within a week from date of receipt. To add a visitor back to your list, please submit a new visiting application with current information. If you have any questions or concerns, send an inmate communications to ISU, 2575 Center St NE, Salem, OR 97301.

### **Statewide Photo Shop**

The statewide photo shop is being moved back into the institutions. In order to make this transition, photo ticket sales have been suspended effective May 4th. If you have already purchased photo tickets, you will be able to use them until August 4th. No refunds or credits will be issued.

### **Inmate Communications Response Time**

Per DOC Rule 291-109-0120, "DOC staff should make every effort to respond to an inmate communication form within seven days of receipt".

Please allow staff this time to respond. Please do not send multiple communications to different staff members regarding the same issue.

---

### **When requesting an incentive level override, the following minimum requirements must be met:**

- AIC will submit a request, in writing, outlining what they have been participating in and/or accomplished to better themselves to justify consideration for an incentive level override.
- No Misconduct Reports in the last 8 months
- No Program Failures in the last 6 months

If AIC reverts back to poor behavior, incentive level will go back down

**Appropriate Clothing/Dress:** In order to maintain a positive environment for all inmates and visitors, a reasonable clothing standard must be established. Visitors are encouraged to wear clothing that is conservative in nature in order to maintain a respectful visiting environment. Some types of clothing may also be prohibited to maintain the security of the facility. Children eight years of age and under are not subject to the following clothing restrictions, other than undergarments.

- (a) Visitors are not allowed to wear blue denim or clothing (blue t-shirts or blue shirts) that is similar to inmate attire. This restriction is necessary to ensure the safety of all individuals if an emergency arises. Visitors should check with the specific facility they are visiting to inquire about clothing that is prohibited because it is similar to inmate attire.
- (b) Clothing that is unduly suggestive or form fitting is prohibited as it may draw undue attention.
- (c) Dresses, skirts, jumpers, culottes, and shorts shall not be worn more than two inches above the middle of the kneecap. Slit dresses/skirts shall be permitted only if the slit is not more than two inches above the middle of the kneecap. Wrap around skirts are not permitted.
- (d) Clothing that exposes an undue amount of flesh (e.g., exposing chest, back, thighs, or midsection) is prohibited. Examples of clothing that will be prohibited include: halter tops/dress, tube tops, see-through clothing, sheer fabrics, mini-skirts, shirts with low cut neck lines, wrap around skirts, and crop tops.
- (e) Visitors are required to wear undergarments.
- (f) Umbrellas, hats, outer garments such as raincoats, ski jackets and other garments that protect against rain and other inclement weather are normally prohibited within the main visiting room. Some visiting rooms require outside travel once checked in. In these cases, the institution will provide a designated area for the garment.
- (g) Light-weight sweaters, jackets, and sport or suit coats are permitted, but must be worn by the visitor during the entire visiting session. Hooded sweatshirts and lined jackets or coats are permitted.
- (h) Accommodations will be made on a case-by-case basis for religious head gear consistent with security practices. Where possible, arrangements should be made prior to visit.
- (i) Clothing, hairstyles, insignias or other paraphernalia associated with security threat groups or that create undue attention or conflict are prohibited; i.e., camouflage clothing, slogans, suggestive, or controversial statements.
- (j) Footwear must be worn.

- If you need to be seen, or have a medical, dental, optical, medication issue, please call MS. You will speak to a MS staff member to determine if you will be seen immediately or if you will be scheduled for an appointment.
- Please do not send an inmate communication to MS, please call to discuss your issues.
- If a medical emergency happens on your unit, please notify the housing officer immediately so that appropriate action can be initiated.

Our vender is making necessary updates to the soda tickets we currently carry which will create the following temporary disruptions in service.

Effective May 30, 2018, all soda ticket sales will be suspended. It is necessary to suspend sales in order to transition to the new tickets. The soda machines will continue taking the old coupons until July 1, 2018. In this time you will need to use the tickets you have in your possession, no credits, exchanges or refunds will be given.

Effective July 2, 2018, the machines will only accept the new soda tickets.

We apologize for the necessary inconveniences this will cause. Commissary is making every effort to make the transition as smooth as possible for all parties involved. We appreciate your patience during the transition period.

- May 30, 2018 – all soda ticket sales suspended

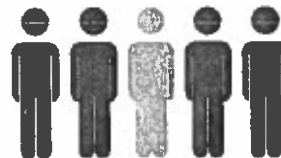
The perk of knowing your HIV status

### WHY GETTING TESTED MATTERS

If you are HIV negative and you know your status you can

1. Relieve yourself of anxiety
2. Take steps to continue or START reducing your risk of getting infected.

If you are HIV positive and you know your status, you can

1. Take steps to prevent passing the infection on to other people.
2. Seek out support to help you manage your care.
3. Start treatment. Following your treatment plan can help lower the amount of virus in your body and ultimately help you live longer.

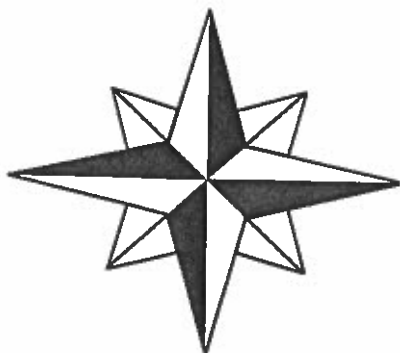
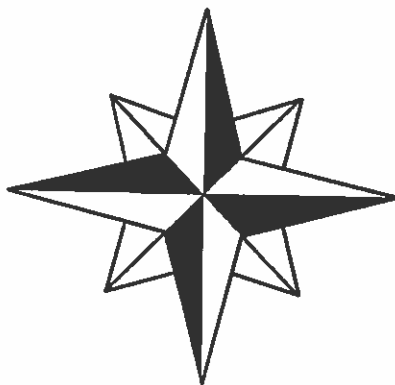

### Here's what a G.P. Committee member has to say

Since coming into this program I've struggled, I've laughed uncontrollably and I've cried harder than I ever have before. All understandably so.

My opinion is if you were say this program is easy then maybe you're not taking it seriously or looking deep enough. Because it is anything but. Truth of the matter is I was always trying to live life on my terms not life's itself. I was lost wandering the streets for a very long time before coming to prison. I was lost in my addiction and my own selfishness. I had so many negative core beliefs it was borderline disgusting. I couldn't even say or tell you what the word integrity meant.

I came into this program a 37 yr old passive man-child with a mentality of a 17 yr old. I'm leaving this program a 37 yr old man who's respectful, respected, and assertive. Who is ready to deal with life on life's terms. I've got tools I never had before; I've got confidence, self-esteem, and integrity. I've found my higher power and submitted to my addiction. I finally realized I truly am powerless over my addiction.

For myself it wasn't until about 25-30 days into phase 2 I started believing what I was being taught or trying to learn about myself. And it all hit at once. It changed me forever overnight. I'll be forever thankful for the A.I.P program. It changed my life. I've never felt so in control. The confidence I gained from the program alone is priceless. You get out what you put in. If you're ready to change then buckle up and get ready. If you only put in 50 percent then that's what you'll get out of it. Above all else just give it an honest chance. Be honest with yourself and your brothers in recovery. You just might surprise yourself on what you learn or find out about yourself. One of the most powerful quotes or sayings I heard and tell people is. "If you can't feel it, you can't heal it". Thank you counselors and NDN for this 2<sup>nd</sup> chance at life.

- Have a GED or higher.
- Have a MINIMUM of 6 months clear conduct.
- Have a MINIMUM of 4 months in DOC custody.
- No program failures within the previous 6 months.
- Must have a verified Social Security Number.
- Preferred to have at least 12 months left on current sentence.
- Possess the ability to read, write and speak English well.

PRAS:  
0-6 months 11 PRAS points + a Team Goal Award PRAS match. 6-24 months 14 PRAS points + a Team Goal Award PRAS match. 24 months or more 16 PRAS points + a Team Goal Award PRAS match. Clerks and Trainers 17 PRAS points + a Team Goal Award PRAS match. Plus you are eligible to receive an added bonus from this company for which you will work.
