Food Theft

Food theft from the Culinary is a major problem for the Institution. It impacts our ability to ensure adequate portions of the published menu are available. It also jeopardizes the health of individuals taking food that is perishable and not being properly stored or cooked. It also has a significant effect on our ability to work within our food service budget.

This notice constitutes a direct order that you are not to take any food items from the Kitchen other than uncut fruit in the quantity served. (Per your Inmate Handbook). The following plan was designed to address this issue in a reasonable, consistent way.

1. If an inmate is caught stealing or attempting to steal food, the food will be confiscated and disposed of accordingly. If the value of the food is less than \$20, the inmate will be issued a minor misconduct report. The minor misconduct report will be for disobedience of an Order III and will include the cost of all food items that have to be

disposed of due to the theft/attempted theft or misuse. If the value of the food is \$20 or more, the inmate will receive a major misconduct order for Contraband II and will also be charged for the cost of food that has to be disposed of.

2. If the inmate stealing the food is assigned to the Kitchen or Dining Room, they will receive a program failure along with the Misconduct Report.
3. This process will be used for foodstuffs found outside the Culinary Section (for example cell searches, etcetera) if the items can reasonably be determined to have been taken from the Food Services.

Note: This does not prevent a staff member from issuing a misconduct report for a higher level charge (Contraband II) in the event the inmate has received a recent previous minor misconduct for the same conduct.

Presidents Meeting Minutes From May 22, 2018
Topics Discussed:

1. Update on prior meeting Action Item Log:
 - a. Captain Bellman addressed the issue regarding evening showers and education/chapel so people can take part in 7:00 p.m. showers and afterwards return to Education and Chapel.
 - b. Captain Bellman addressed concerns over staff shining lights in people eyes, staff having their radios turned up, and in general making excess noise when walking the tiers. This should not be happening anymore, and if it does, let Captain Bellman know.
 - c. Due to staffing issues and time frames of meals, Mr. Kelly is not willing to run an early yardline at 4:30 p.m. for blocks without yard that night.
 - d. As long as Call Center staff are willing to pick up the food from Activities during afternoon fundraisers, Mr. Wilson is okay with the Call Center having their food at their work site since they have an allotted amount of time they need to be on the phones.
 - e. Mr. Kelly is okay with shaker bottles, water bottles, and cups going through the security gate, as long as they don't have liquid in them.
 - f. Mr. Kelly has been working on people being notified of visits in a timely manner.
 - g. If someone is suspended from tablet usage and there are any issues with that procedure, Mr. Toombs in the Mailroom or Ms. Gushard in the Superintendent's office are the people to contact.
 - h. Captain Bellman will look into the 1:00 p.m. Chapel line being run at 1:00 p.m., even if yard is not run then, since Chapel is by turnout.
 - i. The Physical Plant has plans to clean and repair windows in the housing units.
2. Telmate Issues
 - a. The Infirmary does not receive reception for tablets. Mr. Wilson will ask Telmate if they would be willing to install the necessary equipment for this to happen. If not, due to cost, it was asked what that

cost would be, which Mr. Wilson will inquire about if Telmate is unwilling to cover the cost.

- b. When an inmate's family does not have money on their Telmate account, the inmate can press #2 to give their family the opportunity to put money on their account with their credit card. This option is apparently available twice per month. In addition, if the family does not have money on their account, the inmate is given one free three-minute phone call per month. The problem is that when the inmate presses #2, if the family member does not put money on their account with their credit card, it prevents the inmate from using #2 with any other person that month and it removes the option of a free three-minute phone that month. Mr. Wilson will talk to Telmate about the matter.
3. The physical plant checked water temperatures in the housing units and found that in D-Block on 3 bar and above, the water temperature is lower than elsewhere in the prison. So far, the issue had not been identified, but the physical plant is aware and is working on the matter.
4. It was asked if restroom breaks could take place in the visiting room on weekends. Mr. Kelly stated that beginning Saturday, May 26, 2018, restroom breaks will be tried on weekends.
5. There were still issues with guys coming in from yard, at optional, and not being allowed to go to 7:00 p.m. showers, when they have shower stickers. Captain Bellman dealt with the issue and stated that if it happens again, the inmate should go talk to the OIC to get to showers.
6. There are questions regarding how funds deposited to inmate accounts will be removed under the new rule. The OSP administration does not have anything to do with that so Mr. Wilson will invite Mr. Culp from Central Trust to attend the June President's meeting to answer questions.

AVP Workshop

The Alternatives to Violence Project (AVP) is holding a beginning workshop on Friday, September 21, 2018, and Friday, September 28, 2018. It is a two-day, all day, workshop from 7:15 a.m. until 2:20 p.m. and again from 5:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Participants need to be

able to attend all day for both days. We can have four incentive level 1 participants with everyone else needing to be level 2 or 3.

In AVP, people learn about and practice living a life of dignity and self-respect in a non-violent manner. If you would like to take part in this AVP beginning workshop, please send an inmate communication to AVP in Activities. We only have room for 20 people; so do not delay in signing up. If you have any scheduling conflicts, you will need to have your work supervisor, or any other program supervisor, sign your inmate communication stating it is ok for you to miss work, or any other programs you are involved in, both days so you can be added to the turnout.
