Transitional Savings Account Information

Background Information

The Department of Corrections (DOC) is authorized to collect a portion of trust account deposits for two important reasons.

- Transitional savings account and
- Court-ordered financial obligations

Funds subject to collection would include discretionary monetary awards made by DOC to Adults-in-Custody (AICs) under the Performance Recognition and Award System (PRAS) out of legislatively-appropriated funds, and deposits made on an AIC's General Spending Trust account. These changes only impact deposits, money already in trust accounts are not subject to collection.

Transitional savings account

DOC will establish a transitional saving account for men and women in custody, which will be given to them upon release from DOC. The goal is to reach \$500 in a savings account for everyone eligible for release. To that end,

- Five percent of deposits will be placed into a transitional savings account.
- Once \$500 has been reached, and no other debt is owed, transitional savings account deposits will be optional.
- The Transitional savings account is protected from garnishment.

(Note: AICs who do not have a projected release date or are ineligible for parole are not eligible to participate.)

Court-ordered financial obligations

If an AIC has court-ordered financial obligations, DOC will collect the following from each eligible deposit:

- 10 percent for court-ordered obligations.
- Once transitional savings account reaches \$500, DOC will collect 15 percent for court-ordered obligations.

The following court ordered financial obligations, shall be collected by DOC if identified by the Oregon Judicial Department (OJD) or the Department of Justice (DOJ) as owed. Court-ordered obligations include the items listed below in the following order:

First Priority

Compensatory fines, victim's restitution, and criminal fines and fees.

Second Priority

Child support obligations and other victim civil judgments.

Third Priority

Civil judgments for money damages in favor of DOC and OCE employees arising from assaults and other costs and fees arising from inmate litigation.

Updated timeline

- **July 2018**
 - On July 1 2018, DOC will begin to collect money from deposits for a reentry savings account.
- **Early fall 2018**
 - The department will begin to collect level 1 obligations, which are fines, fees and restitution owed to state courts.
 - The department will begin to collect staff civil judgments against DOC employees.
- **2019 and beyond**
 - The Department of Justice (DOJ) and the courts are working on processes to identify and match child support and civil judgments to men and women in DOC custody. This process will be defined in 2019 and beyond.

LOP Status and Tablet Usage

All Adults in Custody that maintain or receive a LOP (Loss of Privileges) Status will have their tablet privileges suspended for the duration they are on LOP. Once the LOP restriction is lifted, tablet usage will be fully reinstated.

Envelopes

Inmates are to immediately place their SID # on their envelopes (in ink) within the first hour of purchase. Inmates found with unmarked envelopes may face disciplinary action. All unmarked envelopes found by staff will be confiscated and become property of the DOC.

General Services

Food Theft

Food theft from the Culinary is a major problem for the Institution. It impacts our ability to ensure adequate portions of the published menu are available. It also jeopardizes the health of individuals taking food that is perishable and not being properly stored or cooked. It also has a significant effect on our ability to work within our food service budget.

This notice constitutes a direct order that you are not to take any food items from the Kitchen other than uncut fruit in the quantity served. (Per your Inmate Handbook). The following plan was designed to address this issue in a reasonable, consistent way.

1. If an inmate is caught stealing or attempting to steal food, the food will be confiscated and disposed of accordingly. If the value of the food is less than \$20, the inmate will be issued a minor misconduct report. The minor misconduct report will be for disobedience of an Order III and will include the cost of all food items that have to be disposed of due to the theft/attempted theft or misuse. If the value of the food is \$20 or more, the inmate will receive a major misconduct order for Contraband II and will also be charged for the cost of food that has to be disposed of.
2. If the inmate stealing the food is assigned to the Kitchen or Dining Room, they will receive a program failure along with the Misconduct Report.
3. This process will be used for foodstuffs found outside the Culinary Section (for example cell searches, etcetera) if the items can reasonably be determined to have been taken from the Food Services.

Note: This does not prevent a staff member from issuing a misconduct report for a higher level charge (Contraband II) in the event the inmate has received a

recent previous minor misconduct for the same conduct.
