Food Theft

Food theft from the Culinary is a major problem for the Institution. It impacts our ability to ensure adequate portions of the published menu are available. It also jeopardizes the health of individuals taking food that is perishable and not being properly stored or cooked. It also has a significant effect on our ability to work within our food service budget.

This notice constitutes a direct order that you are not to take any food items from the Kitchen other than uncut fruit in the quantity served. (Per your Inmate Handbook). The following plan was designed to address this issue in a reasonable, consistent way.

1. If an inmate is caught stealing or attempting to steal food, the food will be confiscated and disposed of accordingly. If the value of the food is less than \$20, the inmate will be issued a minor misconduct report. The minor misconduct report will be for disobedience of an Order III and will include the cost of all food items that have to be

disposed of due to the theft/attempted theft or misuse. If the value of the food is \$20 or more, the inmate will receive a major misconduct order for Contraband II and will also be charged for the cost of food that has to be disposed of.

2. If the inmate stealing the food is assigned to the Kitchen or Dining Room, they will receive a program failure along with the Misconduct Report.

3. This process will be used for foodstuffs found outside the Culinary Section (for example cell searches, etcetera) if the items can reasonably be determined to have been taken from the Food Services.

Note: This does not prevent a staff member from issuing a misconduct report for a higher level charge (Contraband II) in the event the inmate has received a recent previous minor misconduct for the same conduct.

Presidents Meeting Minutes from July 24, 2018

Topics Discussed

1. Review of last month's action item log:
 - a. Information regarding the new inmate deposit withdrawals was published in the Walled Street.
 - b. Mr. Wilson is still waiting for Telmate to come up with a cost to install tablets in the Infirmary. He said it might take a few months due to contract negotiations between DOC and Telmate.
 - c. Mr. Powers, Culinary Manager, implemented a new policy that only one bowl would be filled at a time on the serving line and the machine that cleans the bowls was repaired.
2. There was a discussion regarding the on-going heat in the housing units. Items such as having fans in the ceiling that blow air out of the housing units, geothermal units under the housing units, and fans being installed on the windows that blow air out – like A-Block has – were all discussed as possible options. Mr. Yoder said he will talk with HVAC personnel to see what ideas they come up with to address the issue. It was asked if fans could be sold for some temporary relief. Since most other

prisons have regulated temperatures, it would need to be sold as an institution specific item. Mr. Wagner said if a club writes a proposal and provides a sample of a fan, he would talk to the committee regarding institution specific items to see if it could be approved to sell. The concern is if the motors could be used for other things but it was brought up that other items have been sold with motors, so this should not be a limiting factor.

3. It was suggested that windows and walls in C-Block need some repairs. Mr. Yoder said the Physical Plant does not have any work orders regarding the matter. He said if someone sees something that needs repaired, they should ask their block sergeant to submit an electronic work order to the Physical Plant. There is only one painter so Mr. Yoder said that painting would need to wait until winter but plaster and window repairs could be completed, if a work order is submitted.
4. It was asked if a third showerhead could be added to the cold shower on the yard. Mr. Yoder said that won't happen because the drain wouldn't be able to handle that much water.
5. Since yardline is sometimes run late, it was asked if runners on the yard could use the phones when yardline would normally be run. Mr. Wagner will get back to the Presidents on this matter.
6. Mr. Wilson stated that this would be his last Presidents' meeting as the Assistant Superintendent of Rehabilitative Services as he and Mr. Briones are switching jobs the first of August.
