DID YOU KNOW?

Testing for HIV and Hepatitis in ODOC is Free and Confidential!

Who should be tested?

- Anyone who has participated in unprotected sex
- Anyone born from 1945-1965 is 5X's more likely to be infect with HCV
- Anyone who has ever injected illegal drugs even if it was only once many years ago
- Anyone who was born to an HIV or HCV+ Mother
- Anyone who is infected with HCV should be tested for HIV
- Anyone who is infected with HIV should be tested for HCV
- Anyone who had a blood transfusion or organ transplant before July 1992
- Anyone who received clotting factor concentrates made before 1987
- Anyone who has had a non-sterile tattoo in prison or on the street
- Anyone with signs or symptoms of liver disease (e.g., abnormal liver enzymes)

Know your status
Knowledge = POWER

Will you have ID upon release?

KYTE - "TRCI Records" and ask what forms of ID are in your file.

Birth Certificates:

Can be applied for at any time. Please allow ample time to have your request processed. KYTE - D. Moss or M. Wampler @ TRCI Records

Social Security Card:

Can be applied for 180 days prior to release. KYTE - D. Moss or M. Wampler @ TRCI Records

State ID Cards: An ODOC process determines "State ID" eligibility. If you qualify for an ID card, your ID will be ready upon release. You cannot request an ID yourself.

Contacting the Release Counselor – A release counselor will contact you at 90 to 120 days until release. The release counselor can answer questions and provide known details concerning your release.

EARTH DAY 11 FACTS ABOUT EARTH DAY

1. The first Earth Day was celebrated on April 22, 1970
2. Earth Day originated in the US but became recognized worldwide by 1990.
3. On Earth Day 2009, Disney released a documentary film called Earth that followed the migration paths of four animal families.
4. On the very first Earth Day, 20 million people gathered in the streets of America to protest the industrial revolution. An environmental movement was born as a result.

5. Every year on April 22, men, women, and children collect garbage, plant trees, clean up coral reefs, show movies, sign petitions, and plan for a better future for our planet.
6. Gaylord Nelson founded Earth Day while he was working as a US senator.
7. Earth Day was renamed officially by the UN in 2009 as International Mother Earth Day.
8. Some schools and communities celebrate Earth Day for a whole week to expand the time frame that people focus on the earth and how they can preserve it.

Easter Trivia

The name Easter derived its name from the Anglo-Saxon goddess Eastre, which symbolizes hare and egg.

- Easter always falls between March 22 and April 25.
- Easter is however now celebrated (in the words of the Book of Common Prayer) on the first Sunday after the full moon, which happens on, or after March 21, the Spring Equinox.
- Since time immemorial, the egg has been considered as the symbol of rebirth.
- The first Easter baskets were designed as such so as to give it an appearance of a bird's nests.
- The custom of giving eggs at Easter time has been traced back from Egyptians, Gaul, Persians, Greeks and Romans, to whom the egg was a symbol of life.
- During the medieval times, a festival of egg throwing was held in church, during which the priest would throw a hard-boiled egg to one of the choirboys. It would then be tossed from one choirboy to the next and whoever held the egg when the clock struck 12 was surely the winner and retained the egg.

PROPOSED RULES:

Below is a list of status changes for the DOC administrative rules since 01/31/18:

291-022: Use of Force (Community Corrections)

- Updates the rules pertaining to when body armor shall be worn.

291-105: Prohibited Inmate Conduct and Processing Disciplinary Sanctions

- Updates the department's rules to expand the ability to manage inmates in disciplinary segregation housing and clarifies the process for adjustments to final orders. These changes will align these rules to OAR 291-011-0030.

291-205: Victim Services Programs

- Updates the department's rules to add new Victim Services programs and ensures that the communications of these programs are handled in accordance to 2017 Or Law Ch 114.

291-207: Correctional Case Management

- Updates the department's rules relating to the preparation of proposed release plans for inmates. Amends the timeframes for submitting proposed release plans to the Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.

The last day to submit comments is **April 20, 2018.**

DOC rules are available for review in the inmate legal library.

Once you gain TRCI approval for your classes, word processing and exam proctoring may be available.

FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

The Education Department is often asked about Financial Aid and funding for college after release. We hope that this article answers your questions.

When you enroll at a college, you are asked to fill out a FAFSA application. This application is required to apply for Education Grants, Student Loans, Work Study Jobs at the school, and Scholarships.

FAFSA's funding is not usable in prison.

You must be enrolled in classes for the school to receive funds. FAFSA payments are made to the school, not you...

FAFSA's are good from July 1st of the current year to June 30th of the next year. So, keep this in mind as you plan your release. You must be releasing within a year or less to apply.

FAFSA requirements: You must have a High School Diploma or a GED to apply for funding. Registration for Selective Service is required prior to your 26th Birthday, no drug convictions while previously accepting financial aid, you'll need to include your earnings for the previous year, and if born after 1994, your parent's financial information is required to complete the application.

If you have an outstanding Student Loan, you must contact your loan servicer to arrange deferment or a payment schedule. If you have an outstanding loan, you will be denied additional funds.

A Federal School Code is required to verify the school you wish to attend is an approved school that can receive FAFSA funds.

If you are interested in applying for College funding with a FAFSA, the EDUCATION Department will send a questionnaire. If you qualify for a FAFSA, a callout will be scheduled to help with the completion of the application. Make certain to use the proper envelope for mailing out this application. Send an Inmate Communication Form to "TRCI Education" to start the application process...
