1. You must be incentive Level 3 by May 1st 2019 to attend the picnic
2. The Maximum allowed Guests per inmate is 3 Guests.
3. Request your Approved Visitor List from Ms. Fogg.
4. Circle the Guests that you want to attend on your Authorized Guest list and return this to Recreation.
5. Upon receipt of your approved guest list Recreation will send you a Special CD-28 to fill out and return to Recreation.
6. May 1st 2019 is the deadline to have all paperwork turned into Recreation, failure of you turning in your Approved Visitors list and your Special CD-28 by the May 1st Deadline , will result in you not attending the 2019 picnic
7. You will attend the Picnic based on the unit you sign up on, if you move to another unit prior to the picnic you will still attend the date you sign up on.
8. There will be no Refunds if your Family does not attend and you will only receive your one meal.

Senate Bill 844 Update - Inmate Communication

Please read the below information for an update on the next phase of Senate Bill 844 (ORS 423.105).

The Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) will not collect a portion of eligible trust account deposits for Court Ordered Financial Obligations (COFO) starting on January 1, 2019. Additional time is required to ensure the money is collected correctly. Doc is working with the Oregon Judicial Department to guarantee the technology is functioning as required/

There is no new implementation date. Transitional savings accounts will continue as already established.

Proposed Rules

291-127 DOC Visitation Program

- Adopts new rules to update language and provide clearer instructions related to the visiting process to assist inmates, prospective visitors, and staff.
- Last day to submit comments: 02/08/19

291-031 Community Corrections Programs

- Updates the established processes used to support county community corrections programs that provide appropriate sentencing alternatives and improve local services for persons charged with criminal offenses. These changes are necessary in order to carry out recent legislative changes made to drug related misdemeanors.
- Last day to submit comments: 02/08/19

- Adopts new rules to update language and provide clearer instructions related to the visiting process to assist inmates, prospective visitors, and staff.
- Effective Date: 12/17/18-6/24/19

Law Library News



Legal Library is expanding!

Grand opening of TRCI's East legal library will be January 4th, 2018. The new East Library will accommodate inmates that are housed in corridors three and four as well as Unit 22, 26 and DSU. The existing Library will become West library and will accommodate inmates in corridors one and two as well as AHU. In preparation for this move, the libraries will be closed from December 31st, 2018 until the January 4th, 2019 opening. Please plan your legal needs accordingly for this closure.

With this move, we will also be implementing word processing and thumb drives for Priority Legal users. The current Legal computers and typewriters will be removed from all general population housing units. These changes will allow TRCI to be parallel with other institutions around the state.

Both libraries will afford inmates reasonable access to law library services, equipment, and necessary supplies for the preparation and filing of legal documents with the courts and paroling authorities, on a prioritized basis, based on OAR 291-139. For all requests to the library please submit a law library request form, available from the unit officer, so that the library coordinators can schedule your callouts accordingly. We thank you for your patience and understanding during this transition.

News from R&D

(Send a separate kyte for each issue)

1. **Combination Locks:** (Need One, or need your combination)
2. **Mail Outs:** Artwork, Books, Excess property. (must have funds available) R&D has various sizes of boxes available. Please bring your address book with you.
3. **Visitor Property Pick Up:** Kyte one week before your visitor arrives for the visit. You will be called down the day before your visit. Bring all property or items to R&D. No Artwork or Canteen items may be sent out as a Visitor Property Pick Up.
4. **Priority Envelopes:** (From Canteen) Priority Envelopes are to be mailed out through R&D, not the unit. You will be called down on Fridays. Do not seal the envelopes before coming to R&D.
5. **Identification Cards (ID's):** Please see pages 6-7 of the inmate handbook for your responsibilities of your ID. The cost of a replacement ID is \$5.
6. **Television Stands and Coaxial Cables**
7. **Hot Trash of Personal Property:** Do not throw away Personal Property (shoes, headphones, etc). Obtain a Shakedown Slip from R&D to have your property removed from the Offender Management System (OMS).
8. **Canteen Items:** Canteen shoes, Televisions and Incentive Items are usually issued on Fridays in R&D. R&D cannot answer questions about Canteen purchased items that have not been delivered to R&D. Please send a kyte to Canteen about those issues.
9. **Red Address Books:** These are only issued to General Population through R&D. DSU Population gets Address Books from DSU staff.
10. **Indigent Earbuds:** R&D is currently out of indigent earbuds at this time. Watch future Newsletters for when they will become available again.
11. **Clothing Issues:** Address your kyte to the Clothing Sergeant. This includes Pillows and Mattresses.

NOTE:

Confiscated Property issues: When you have property Confiscated due to a shake down or Segregation placement and it is sent to R&D. You have 45 days to contact R&D to either show proof of purchase, Mail out, or hot trash the item. If it is because of a Segregation placement the 45 days starts when you are released from Segregation. After 45 days with no contact from you the property will be hot trashed.
