From the Administrative Rules Program:

Below is the list of status changes made to DOC administrative rules since 07/10/19.

PROPOSED RULES:

Division 032 Land Use Coordination (291-032)

- Amends the rules to better reflect the current practices and applicable rules and law references.
- Last date to provide comments: 11/06/19

Division 130 Telephones (AIC) (291-130)

- Amends the rules to expand the parameters regarding an AICs ability to make legal calls and adopts new rules to establish the parameters around PREA advocacy crisis line calls.
- Last date to provide comments: 11/06/19

Division 210 Transgender and Intersex Adults in Custody (291-210)

- Amends the rules to reflect consistent standards for unclothed searches and the collection of urinalysis samples for the purpose of drug screening.
- Last day to provide comments: 11/06/19

Rulemaking comments must be provided to the DOC Rules Coordinator in writing. Communications submitted should be limited to providing comments on only one division/topic per communication. Do not include multiple divisions/topics in one communication. DOC rules are available for review and copies in the inmate law library.

Proposed, temporary, and permanently adopted rules are available for review in the inmate Legal Library. Personal copies may be obtained by sending form CD1762, "Legal Photocopy Request Form," to M. Davidson, Library Coordinator.

Inmates in special housing units may access copies of proposed rules and permanently adopted rules for review by asking the housing unit officer. Personal copies may be obtained by sending form CD1762, "Legal Photocopy Request Form," to M. Davidson, Library Coordinator.

Proposed rules will be copied free of charge. If you want a personal copy of a permanently adopted rule, there will be a charge for the copy.

Skin Infections Your Best Defense!

Your skin is your best defense against infection and disease. Sometimes your skin can be invaded by tiny bacteria that causes a skin infection. Taking care of it just makes sense, especially living in close quarters.

A skin infection is spread from person to person by touching someone who has a break in their skin or who shares objects like towels. The infection looks like a pimple, a boil or a spider bite. The sore is red and won't heal. It gets worse quickly. It fills with pus. Don't squeeze it! This will just spread the germs. Attend AM Triage right away if you think you have a skin infection. Most skin infections are treatable with the right self-care or antibiotics.

In the Meantime ...

- Keep all cuts and scrapes clean and dry until healed.
- Avoid skin-to-skin touching with others who have skin infections or a break in skin.
- Disinfect weight machines and high usage surfaces on a regular basis.
- Don't share personal items.
- And most important...WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY!

If I have a skin infection how can I keep from spreading it to others?

- Advise those around you to wash their hands frequently.
- Do not share personal items, or other items that may have had contact with the infected wound or wound drainage.
- Disinfect all non-clothing items that might come in contact with the wound (i.e. exercise equipment).
- Avoid participating in contact sports or other skin-to-skin contact until your infection has healed.

Be sure to follow all instructions from your healthcare provider and if prescribed antibiotics, take all your pills, even when you start to notice improvement in symptoms
