Visiting Rule Changes:

Below is a list of some of the changes that were made to the DOC Administrative Rule regarding visiting, effective July 1, 2019.

- A person who within the last **three** years has been convicted of any drug related crime or has been sentenced and incarcerated for a felony crime in a state, county or federal corrections facility, is ineligible to visit an AIC in a Department of Corrections facility.
- Once the **three** year restriction has been satisfied, an individual will automatically be eligible to apply for privileged visits. There is no longer a requirement to complete one-year of basic visits.
- AICs assigned to Special Housing units may be permitted basic visiting **with ANY two approved visitors** from their visiting list.
- AICs may be permitted an **unlimited** number of approved visitors on their respective visiting lists.
- Approved visitors will automatically be placed on an AICs visiting list. An AIC can decline the visitor being added to their list by submitting a written request to the Inmate Services Unit.
- If a visitor has not visited an AIC within the previous two years, **the visitor will be automatically removed the AIC's visiting list and the AIC will be notified.** In such an event, the **visitor** must submit a new application to be added to the list.
- An AIC assigned to General Population restricted to basic visiting shall be permitted eight visiting sessions per month. It is no longer required to have four of the visits be on weekdays.
- Biological grandchildren have been added to the list of minor eligible children that are allowed to visit AICs with a conviction for current or prior sexual crimes.

Furniture Factory Position

We are looking for AICs to work in the Furniture Factory in the certification program. The requirements are:

- *Six months clear conduct.
- *No positive urinalysis test in the past six months.
- *Be within a maximum of six years and a minimum of 18 months to a release date.
- *Possess a high school diploma, GED certification or be in the process of obtaining a GED certification within a specified period of time.
- *Be compliant with all other institution programming.

Religious Head Coverings

Effective April 1, 2019, the Oregon Department of Corrections, statewide, approved Inmates to wear their Religious Head Coverings outside of their cell.

Religious Head coverings (Not including dew rags, stocking caps, or ball caps) may be worn as any time unless otherwise restricted for safety/security concerns (for example while working with machinery, visiting, and Dining Room).

Staff may inspect a religious head covering by directing the inmate to remove the item and hold it out so the item can be easily observed and searched without being touched.

The inmate may be directed to unfold/unwrap the item for closer inspection/search.
