

Hearing Notice from the Court

What do I do as an AIC that receives a Hearing Notice?

Unable to contact the court with the phones here Contact staff here.

The best way to be able to proceed:

Contact family/friends and give them the information on the Hearing Notice:

Contact number on the Hearings Notice – SCI is conducting phone calls (at this time)

Give the case number, your full name and SID# to your contact, THEN your contact
can call the court. They can give out the SCI staff information in the next step

Give your contact (Family/Friend) the staff contact (Ms. Moya 503-378-2964) OR DOC
website for professional calls (follow prompts under SCI section)

#### What happens next?

Court contacts Ms. Mazalyns to schedule
Call-out is entered & a reminder kyte sent
Complete your call in assigned location (Unit 2 call room)

Do I need to follow-up and send a kyte to staff?

If you receive another Hearings Notice from the courts, the process will need to be repeated.

Sometimes you may need to call/ write your attorney, not staff.

From the Administrative Rules Program:

Below is the list of status changes made to DOC administrative rules since 10/25/2022.

#### PROPOSED RULES:

#### 291-121 Handiwork

Repeals the Handiwork rule OAR 291-121 and replaces it with the <u>Learning Entrepreneurship</u>, <u>Arts</u>, <u>and Production (LEAP)</u> Rule in order to allow for more institutions to participate in entrepreneurial programs. The Handiwork OAR 291-121 is outdated and does not allow for the Department of Corrections to expand AIC entrepreneurial craft type of sales to other locations.

#### 291-172 LEAP - Learning Entrepreneurship, Arts, and Production

• Adopts guidelines at participating institutions for a program allowing adults in custody to constructively use non-programming time to engage in a positive learning experience with the possibility to earn funds for use during incarceration or after release. This rule OAR 291-172 LEAP will replace OAR 291-121 Handiwork (AIC), which will be repealed.

#### **TEMPORARY RULES:**

#### 291-124 Health Services

• Amends rule to establish circumstances in which the Department of Corrections will provide medically acceptable durable medical equipment (eyeglasses, medical prostheses, and hearing aids) at state expense, to adults in custody, and procedures concerning the provision of repair and maintenance of that equipment.

Effective 10/26/2022 through 4/23/2023

#### PERMANENT RULES:

#### 291-031 Community Corrections Programs

• Amends rule to (1) clarify requirements specific to the submission timeframe for the biennial community corrections plan, (2) update definitions of the funded workload as a result of SB497 (2021), (3) replace the term "offender" with the "adult on supervision" and (4), make necessary housekeeping changes as a result of changes in business practices as well as those identified during the DOJ review.

Effective 11/7/2022

#### 291-127-0495 Visiting Room Protocol

- (1) Visiting staff will assign seating appropriate for the size and make-up of the group, and space availability. Once visitors and inmates have been assigned seating in the visiting area, changing location requires approval of the visiting room supervisor.
- (2) Visitors approved for privileged visiting may briefly embrace and briefly kiss the inmate at the beginning and end of the visits. Hand-holding and holding of minor children is permitted during the visit.
- (3) Children shall be supervised at all times while in the visitation or play area. Visitors are responsible to ensure that children are not disruptive to the point it interferes with other visits or jeopardizes the security of the visiting environment. If this occurs, a visit may be ended prematurely to remove the child.
- (4) Visitors shall be allowed to breastfeed their child in a suitable location as to minimize the impact on the visit.
- (5) Restrooms are available for visitor use. For the safety of the child, only the visitor may accompany a child to the restroom.
- (6) Once a visitor or an inmate leaves the visiting area (other than to access the restroom or breastfeed), the visit shall be terminated.
- (7) If the facility does not have a restroom designated for inmate use, the visit shall terminate if the inmate leaves to use a restroom. Inmates with a medical condition documented and verified by Health Services staff, may be permitted restroom privileges in those facilities where inmate restrooms are not available.
- (8) Visitors shall not engage in a disturbance, as defined in this rule. Visitors who engage in a disturbance or other inappropriate conduct as defined in these rules, or who loiter in or about a Department of Corrections facility, shall be subject to removal from the facility by Department staff. The officer-in-charge of the facility may notify law enforcement officials for assistance if the visitor refuses to leave the facility when requested by Department staff.
- (9) Visitors and inmates are not permitted to visit with a person who is not specifically authorized for the current visit.

## **Ballot Measure 112**

To: All Adults in Custody

Date: November 30, 2022

This month Oregon voters passed Ballot Measure (BM) 112, which amends Article 1, Section 34 of the Oregon Constitution. BM 112 removes language from Oregon's Constitution that permitted the state to impose involuntary servitude as a punishment for persons convicted of crime. Passage of BM 112 does not change the constitutional requirement that adults in custody (AlCs) work, and it does not entitle AlCs to minimum wage. Adults in custody are still required under Article 1, Section 41 of the Oregon Constitution to actively engage in full-time work or on-the-job training, which may include education.

Para: Todos los adultos bajo custodia

Fecha: 30 de noviembre de 2022

Este mes, los votantes de Oregón aprobaron la Medida electoral (BM) 112, que modifica el Artículo 1, Sección 34 de la Constitución de Oregón. BM 112 elimina el lenguaje de la Constitución de Oregón que permitía al estado imponer la servidumbre involuntaria como castigo para las personas condenadas por un delito.

La aprobación de la BM 112 no cambia el requisito constitucional de que los adultos bajo custodia (AIC) trabajen, y no da derecho a los AIC al salario mínimo. Los adultos bajo custodia todavía están obligados bajo el Artículo 1, Sección 41 de la Constitución de Oregón a participar activamente en un trabajo de tiempo completo o capacitación en el trabajo, que puede incluir educación.
