AIC Handbook Headgear Rules:

When going to meals, you must wear your ID card properly displayed. You may have outgoing mail (which is to be deposited in the appropriate box as soon as you enter the Dining Room), a comb, a handkerchief, a coat, hat, sunglasses, or prescription glasses.

Headgear: Blue knit caps and canteen plain white caps are not authorized for use inside. They can be worn in recreation yards and will not be knotted or altered in any way. White caps will be worn with the brim in the forward position, not backwards or to either side. No headgear will be worn which may cover or fall below the eyebrows. Canteen “doo rags” can be worn in the bunk area and to and from restroom **only**. Plastic shower caps can be worn to and from the shower and restroom **only**.

When attending Med-line, see section n dress and appearance. Same as above wearing headgear is allowed if it is worn appropriately. And removed prior to entering the building.

**You may not wear any** work gear when you are not working (i.e., safety glasses (tinted or clear), boots, hats, gloves, etc.)



March In Oregon’s history. 1707 - 1811

1707  
*San Francisco Xavier* probably wrecks at Nehalem.

1738  
Pierre Gaultier de la Verendrye leads first expedition into Oregon.

1765  
First use of word "Ouragon" in Maj. Robert Rogers' petition to explore American West.

1775-1780  
First smallpox outbreak among Oregon’s indigenous people.

1778  
Capt. James Cook makes landfall at Cape Foulweather and discovers fur wealth of Northwest Coast.

1788  
Capt. Robert Gray trades with tribes in Tillamook Bay Marius Lopus, African traveling with Gray, probably killed at Tillamook

1792  
Capt. Robert Gray enters and names the Columbia River. Capt. George Vancouver expedition charts Columbia estuary Lt. William E. Broughton names Mount Hood after British naval officer Alexander Arthur Hood.

1801-1802  
Second smallpox outbreak among Oregon’s tribes,

1804  
President Thomas Jefferson dispatches Lewis & Clark Expedition.

1805  
Lewis & Clark Expedition explores lower Snake and Columbia Rivers and establishes Fort Clatsop.

1811  
John Jacob Astor’s Pacific Fur Company establishes Fort Astoria.
