Take the Time to Complete an Advance Directive

It is important for family members and health care providers to know what kind of medical care a patient wants at the end of life. Advance directives are legal documents that record the patient's wishes for end-of-life care.

Advance directives should be filled out while people are healthy, because doing so gives you time to think about the end-of-life care that you would choose if you were unable to communicate your own wishes. It also allows time to discuss these wishes with loved ones. Everyone has the right to make decisions about their own treatment. Filling out advance directives gives you a way to do so. Choices about end-of-life care can be difficult to make even when you are healthy, but if you are already seriously ill such decisions can seem overwhelming.

If you would like more information on completing an Advanced Directive, please send an AIC communication to Sick Call. We will send you a handout to help you better understand the process and what it means to you.

To obtain Advance Directive forms, please send an AIC communication to Medical Services. Legal Library can also provide assistance by witnessing your form. To have this occur, you can schedule an appointment for Legal Library. Once your forms are witnessed, attend Triage so your completed Advanced Directive can be added to your Medical Record.
