Hearing Notice from the Court

What do I do as an AIC that receives a Hearing Notice?

Unable to contact the court with the phones here
Contact staff here.

The **best way** to be able to proceed:

Contact family/friends and give them the information on the Hearing Notice:

- Contact number on the Hearings Notice – SCI is conducting phone calls (at this time)
- Give the case number, your full name and SID# to your contact, THEN your contact can call the court. They can give out the SCI staff information in the next step
- Give your contact (Family/Friend) the staff contact (Ms. Moya 503-378-2964) OR DOC website for professional calls (follow prompts under SCI section)

What happens next?

- Court contacts Ms. Moya to schedule
- Call-out is entered & a reminder kyte sent
- Complete your call in assigned location (Unit 2 call room)

Do I need to follow-up and send a kyte to staff?

If you receive another Hearings Notice from the courts, the process will need to be repeated.

Sometimes you may need to call/ write your attorney, not staff.

What You Can Do To Protect Your Credit – Given the ODOT/DMV Data Breach in the News

In mid-June, there was a breach of information at the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and 3.5 million Oregon driver's license and ID cards were impacted. There are immediate steps you can take to protect your information from identity theft. You are entitled to a free copy of your credit report once every 12 months from each of the three major credit reporting agencies, Experian, Equifax, and TransUnion. Effective immediately if an AIC Receives a D.R. and is in a higher paying job 10 pts and above they will be removed from that job and must be clear conduct for 6 months to be eligible for that job again.

<p>Concealed Tobacco Possession:</p> <p>Tobacco that is in a waist band, pocket, sock etc.</p> <p>Found concealed during unclothed search</p> <p>Tobacco that is on an AICs persons</p>	<p>Automatic:</p> <p>Contraband II Major and Distribution II Major Misconduct Report</p>
<p>Flushing of Contraband:</p> <p>The flushing of any Contraband, after being directed by staff to not flush anything</p> <p>Impeding with your ability to identify the contraband</p>	<p>Automatic:</p> <p>Contraband II and Distribution II Major Misconduct Report</p>

Maximum guests are ten (10). All must be on your approved privileged visiting list. The officiant does not need to be on your visiting list, but it is okay if they are

One AIC photographer will be available. If you want pictures, purchase your photo tickets in advance and bring them with you

Note: There will be no reimbursement of travel expenses if the wedding date is canceled or postponed for any reason.

I will have a resource day out in Unit 5 here soon to provide you with resources that you may need, to type up resumes or letters that you may need from classes.

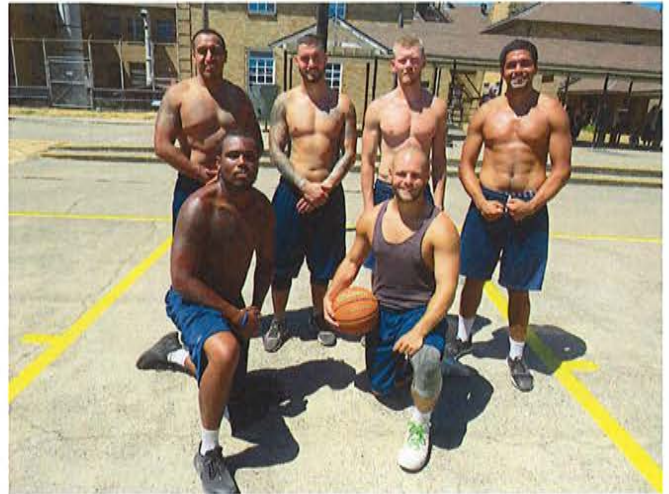
