## From the Administrative Rules Program

Below is the list of status changes made to DOC administrative rules since 2/26/2024.

### PROPOSED RULES:

#### **291-005 Information Systems Access and Security**

- Amends rule to better reflect and implement the direction of the agency, statewide standards, and industry modernization; improve consistency and clarity of the rules; further define and update process; update position titles and timelines; and establish guidelines around separation of duties, authorizing access, shared or group credentials, open user accounts, and physical security.
- Last day of comment period: 4/18/24 at 5:00 PM

#### **291-105 Prohibited Conduct and Processing Disciplinary Actions**

- Amends rule to standardize definitions of terms across Department of Corrections rules; adopt a definition for "digital currency"; and update misconduct violations (Violations Involving Property, Violations Against Persons) to address trends affecting the safety and security of our facilities.
- Last day of comment period: 4/18/24 at 5:00 PM
- Remote Public Hearing: 4/2/24 1:30PM – 2:30PM

#### **291-202 Sex Offenders, Special Provisions**

- Amends rule to incorporate changes in legislation per HB2549 (2013) and HB2520 (2015); to incorporate changes in practice or department philosophy (change "inmate" to "AIC" per HB 3146 (2019); to clarify terminology; to update definitions and statutory references or further define process; to expand exception authority within county community corrections agencies; and to perform technical corrections.

- Last day of comment period: 4/18/24 at 5:00 PM

Rulemaking comments must be provided to the DOC Rules Coordinator in writing at the address in the rulemaking notice. Communications submitted should be limited to providing comments on only one division and topic per communication. Do not include multiple divisions and topics in one communication, they will be returned. DOC notices and rules are available for review and copies in the AIC Law Library.

Proposed, temporary, and permanently adopted rules are available for review in the AIC Legal Library. Personal copies may be obtained by sending form CD1762, "Legal Photocopy Request Form", to R. Polk, Library Coordinator.

AICs in special housing units may access copies of proposed rules and permanently adopted rules for review by asking the housing unit officer. Personal copies may be obtained by sending form CD1762, "Legal Photocopy Request Form", to R. Polk, Library Coordinator.

Proposed rules will be copied free of charge. If you want a personal copy of a permanently adopted rule, there will be a charge for the copy.

## Amendment to the AIC Handbook Pertaining to Authorized Amount of Soda Tickets

Effective April 1, 2024, AICs will not be allowed to have more than fifty (SO) soda tickets in their possession. Soda Tickets in excess of the authorized fifty (SO) will be considered as excessive, deemed as items of barter and discarded in accordance with the property rule regarding contraband. Being in possession of contraband and/or excessive property may result in confiscation of the items(s) and/or disciplinary actions. This does not pertain to the number of tickets allowed



on the yard. AICs may still only have five (5) soda tickets in their possession while on the recreation yard.

## HEALTH SERVICES



### Electronic Health Records

This month, we would like to share information about how your health information will be transferred to the new Electronic Health Records (EHR). An EHR is like a big computer file that stores all your health information in one place. A "scanner" is a copy machine that turns a paper document into an electronic file that is safely and securely stored. Electronic records are easily shared between your doctors, nurses, behavioral health, and dentists at the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) and can be accessed at the same time. This will help them work together, and with you, to make important decisions about your health. Your electronic health records can also be shared with your health providers outside of the DOC, such as an out-of-facility appointment, or upon your release.

Right now, paper medical records are stored in a blue medical chart. But soon, when you visit your DOC healthcare providers, you may start seeing both a blue medical chart and a new green medical chart. The blue chart holds the old paper records that have been scanned in preparation for the EHR, and the green chart contains any new paper records created until the EHR goes live. Eventually, all the paper records will also get scanned and loaded into the EHR.

Please remember that right now, you do not need to do anything different to request to be seen by Health Services. As this exciting project keeps moving forward, please know we will give you more updates through AIC newsletters and flyers.

Este mes nos gustaría compartir información sobre la forma en que su información de salud será transferida a los nuevos Expedientes Electrónicos de Salud (EHR, por sus siglas en inglés). Un EHR es como un gran archivo de computadora que almacena toda su información de salud en un solo lugar. Un "escáner" es una máquina copiadora que convierte un documento en papel en un archivo electrónico que se almacena de forma segura y confiable. Los expedientes electrónicos se comparten fácilmente entre los doctores, enfermeros, especialistas de salud del comportamiento y dentistas en el Departamento Correccional de Oregon (DOC, por sus siglas en inglés) y se puede acceder a ellos al mismo tiempo. Esto les ayudará a trabajar juntos y, con usted, para tomar importantes decisiones para su salud. Sus

expedientes electrónicos de salud también se pueden compartir con sus proveedores de servicios de salud fuera del DOC, como en una cita fuera del centro, o cuando se le libere.

Justo ahora, sus expedientes médicos en papel se almacenan en una carpeta médica azul. Pero pronto, cuando visite a sus proveedores de servicios de salud del DOC, podrá empezar a ver tanto la carpeta médica azul como una nueva carpeta médica verde. La carpeta azul tiene los expedientes en papel que se han escaneado en preparación para el EHR, y la carpeta verde contiene cualquier expediente en papel nuevo creado hasta que el EHR se ponga en marcha. En última instancia, todos los expedientes en papel también se escanearán y se cargarán al EHR.

Por favor, recuerde que ahora mismo no necesita hacer nada diferente para solicitar que le vean en Servicios de salud. Conforme este emocionante proyecto avanza, por favor, tenga en cuenta que le daremos más actualizaciones a través de los boletines de noticias y de los volantes de AIC.

### Sexually Transmitted Disease Testing

Oregon Department of Corrections will now be requiring every Adult in Custody (AIC) to opt-in or opt-out of sexually transmitted disease testing once during their incarceration.

Just like with the flu immunizations, everyone will have to sign a consent form stating yes, they would like testing or no, they are not interested in tested. This will just be for one time during your current sentence. If you paroled and return, you will be required to repeat it at that time.

You will be receiving a form via the AIC communication system that you will be required to fill out. If you live in General Population (GP), Day Treatment Unit (DTU), or Dorm, please return it by putting it in the medical communication form box on the Control Floor. If you are in a Special Housing Unit: Mental Health Infirmity (MHI), Behavior Health Unit (BHU), Disciplinary Segregation Unit (DSU), or Intermediate Care Housing Unit (ICH), please hand it to a nurse as they are making their rounds.

Once the forms have been received back, if you have chosen to be tested, you will be scheduled in the upcoming weeks. If you chose not to be tested, the form will be placed in your chart and your name will be removed from the list. You may always change your mind at any time by sending a new AIC communication to Medical.

If you have recently been tested and chose not to be retested, please opt-out of testing,

**MHI Unit ADL/Peer Companion Position**

We believe that Adults in Custody (AIC) who have proven to be successful in the prison community can provide a valuable resource to peers within that community. By listening to and mentoring peers who are struggling with various disabilities, Peer Companions can help teach them how to more effectively and productively manage their own responses to their environment.

Mental Health Special Housing is now hiring for two, full-time ADL/Peer Companions on the Mental Health Infirmary (MHI) unit. The Individuals selected for this position will report to the MHI unit for their shifts. We are looking for motivated, responsible individuals who have the willingness to work with individuals unable to care for their own ADLs as well as individuals experiencing significant mental health symptoms. It is important for Unit Peer Companion candidates to behave in a manner that is respectful, safe, confidential, and honest, modeling patience, respectful communication, and the following of all unit and institution rules.

MHI Unit ADL/Peer Companions will have specific shifts and are responsible for assisting unit staff, Qualified Mental Health Professionals (QMHP) and treatment staff in ensuring that identified AICs housed on MHI are getting their basic and daily needs met, which helps to improve their functioning and improve their overall quality of life while incarcerated.

Duties may also include assisting individuals around ADL coaching and skillbuilding; increasing social interactions; and guiding or accompanying individuals who have difficulty walking or who are resistant to engaging in activities outside of their cells to activities on the unit, during day room, or out for MHI yard time.

To be eligible, you must be an incentive Level 3 and have clear conduct for at least one year; it is preferred that you have one or more years left on your sentence.

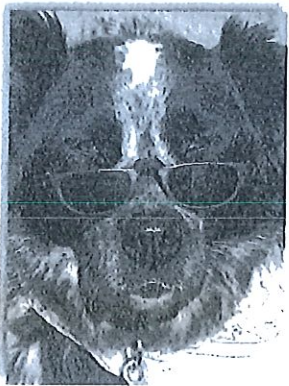




# FELIX IS PAROLING!

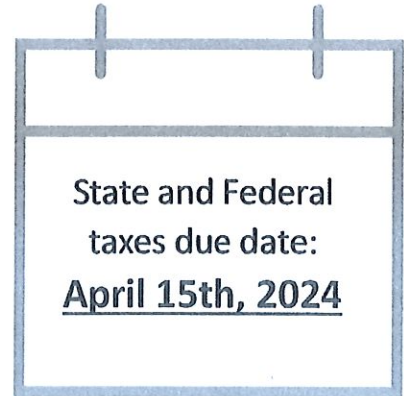

## Informational Briefing

### Adult in Custody (AIC) 2024 Tax Information

The Department of Corrections (DOC) will not provide federal or state tax forms to AICs.

- AICs may write or call the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) or Oregon Department of Revenue to request tax forms.
- AICs may elect to reach out to their friends and family to request they send tax forms in through the mail. All incoming mail is subject to the Departments rule on mail, 291-131-0025.
- DOC staff / legal assistants are not authorized to provide tax advice or status updates on filings to AICs.
- AICs may appoint a qualified and trusted person as their power of attorney (POA) to assist with the tax filing process. POA forms can be obtained by submitting a Library Request form (CD1714).



AICs will need to use their own pre-addressed postage paid envelope for tax correspondence and filings.
