FROM HEALTH SERVICES - AIC ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS (EHR)

April 1, 2024 - Health Services wants to update you throughout the EHR Project and make sure you always have the latest information about how to access health care. Health Services may sometimes repeat information for others who may have missed previous updates and will continue to share new information with you when it becomes available.

One IMPORTANT thing to remember is that for now, you still access health care how you always have in your institution by sending a KYTE request to Health Services.

Small construction projects in place like satellite medical or in the clinic will take place as the EHR Project moves forward. These teams are working hard to make sure your health providers have the EHR tools and equipment ready and available when providing your care in the future

Speaking of the future! When the EHR system starts being used in your institution, your doctors, nurses, dentists, and mental health professionals will be able to see your important health information right on their computer just like when you visit a health provider on the outside.

Finally, Health Services would also like to know that they continue to update your friends and family about the EHR Project through the Department of Corrections Friends and Family publication.
